Event Format:

Registration is open from 08:00am on the 10 September

Archers will be categorised by distance choice unless Para classified.

09:00am - Practice

Three ends. The competition will start straight after practice.

Qualification round

72 arrows shot at the distance of your choice in ends of six.

Head-to-head Matches

Matches between two archers in the same category. Each archer has 20 seconds to shoot each arrow. (Except the W1 category who get 30 seconds in alternate match play)

Scoring

Recurve / W1 Category - Set scoring

Each set consists of three arrows. If an athlete wins the match, they win 2 set points, a tie is worth 1 set point. The winner is the first archer to gain 6 points.

Compound - Cumulative scoring.

Athletes will shoot 5 ends, 3 arrows per end, totalling 15 arrows with a maximum score of 150 points.

*The organising committee reserve the right to combine bow types and/or genders if final entries do not allow for a competitive environment.

*The organising committee may contact archers to change categories if there are an insufficient number of competitive archers within their chosen category.

Eligibility:

Any member of Archery GB or a World Archery association is welcome.

Members must have either a World Archery classification (National or International) or be a **member who considers themselves to have a disability**.

(Athletes must bring their World Archery classification card, or other evidence as appropriate if they are competing in a WA classified event)

Dress:

Please refer to the Archery GB Rules of Shooting for the dress regulations. Other WA member associations may wear their National Team Uniforms, or other garments provided that they are in line with the WA clothing rules (no camo, no blue denim).



	Archers should comply with dress regulations until after the presentations.
<i>Anti-Doping:</i>	<p>Archers competing at record status tournaments could be subject to testing.</p> <p>Competitors who are approached to give samples must comply. Non-compliance will be treated as a positive result.</p> <p>By entering this competition, you consent to testing, if you are entering a minor into this competition you consent to the testing of that minor, this is in line with UK Anti-Doping Policy, Rule 5.7.2.</p>
<i>Photography:</i>	In line with the recommendation in the Archery GB Safeguarding Policy, those who wish to take photographs or video at this event must register with the organisers at registration.
<i>Refreshments:</i>	Lilleshall café - The Pavilion will be open only if numbers allow.
<i>Camping:</i>	Camping will be available close to the shooting field, please book directly through Lilleshall.
<i>Special Note:</i>	<p>Please ensure that the organiser is aware of any specific requirements you have. Please do not assume we already know.</p> <p>Archers who are unable to get the target are asked, if possible, to arrange for an assistant to aid in scoring and arrow collection.</p> <p>Programme athletes are reminded that they train and compete under their athlete agreement and related code of conduct for the duration of their time on an AGB programme.</p> <p>World and European para records can only be claimed by Para classified athletes.</p> <p>All athletes can claim able-bodied, World or British records in line with the World Archery and Archery GB rules.</p> <p>Toilets - There are two disabled access toilets in the pavilion and there will be two disabled porta loos on the field behind the shooting line.</p>
<i>Smoking:</i>	There is strictly no smoking on the tournament field. This includes e-cigarettes.



<i>Car Parking:</i>	Parking will be available close to the shooting field and car parking attendance will be around for support.
<i>Documentation:</i>	Event Information, Target Lists and Results will be published on www.ianseo.net E-mail will be used for entry acknowledgement.
<i>Entry Information:</i>	Entries will be open on the Sport 80 website at 7pm on Thursday 12 May 2022 (https://agb.sport80.com). Price - £20.00 When you enter competitions, the following information may be collected and shared with tournament organisers, scoring systems and other competitors for example target lists and results may be published: First Name, Surname, Gender, Bow style, Date of Birth / Age category, Email, Address, Phone number, Club (and ID), County (and ID), Region (and ID), Round (unless defined by age), Disabled (Y/N), Disability information.
