



## The UK Junior Masters 2023, Hosted by Deer Park Archers

Location	Deer Park Archers, Shurdington Road, Shurdington, Cheltenham, GL51 4TU.																																						
Round	<p>A single WRS/UKRS WA720 qualification round will be shot in the morning (6 arrows in 4 minutes, 2 details per target) followed by head-to-head eliminations in the afternoon.</p> <p>This will be followed by a Champion of Champions shoot-off. Taken from the JAS rankings, the top ranked Male and Female archers in Recurve, Compound and Barebow classes will take part in the 'Champion of Champions' Shoot-off. The archer that has finished first in each JAS category will go through to the shoot off. Additional spaces will allocated to categories with more finalists. 7 or less get 1 space, 8-11 get 2 spaces and 12 ore more receive 3 spaces.</p> <p>The shoot off is an elimination format with each archer shooting 3 arrows in 60 seconds at their respective distance (i.e. RU21 at 70m, RU18 at 60m; RU15 at 50m and RU12 shooting at 30m). The archer with the lowest score drops out until we are left with a winner. In the event of a tie then the nearest to the centre rule will apply</p>

Awards	The UK Junior Masters titles will be awarded to the winners of the Head to Head Round. The Junior Series titles will be awarded to the winners of each Junior Archer Series category. Awards will be made to the Champion of Champion winners, one for each bowtype.																																						

Eligibility	<p>Those under 21 on 31<sup>st</sup> December 2023 and either:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1) Competing in three of the first four Junior Series events in 2023.</li> <li>2) Claiming Junior Master Bowmen or Master Bowman in 2022 (after the 2022 Junior Masters event took place) and/ those claiming in 2023 are eligible to enter. Scores must be submitted to Archery GB and an invite will be issued.</li> </ol> <p>Archers may only shoot the bow style with which they qualified for this event.</p>
Scoring	Please be aware that parents could be asked to help with the scoring.
Dress	Please refer to the Archery GB Rules of Shooting for the dress regulations. Archers should comply with dress regulations until after the presentations.
Drug Testing	As this is a WRS/UKRS Tournament, any athletes approached to give samples MUST comply. If they refuse, that refusal will be treated as a positive result. Parents/Guardians must give consent for under 18s to be drug tested if approached.
Lost Arrows	<p>Lost arrows must be reported to a judge or member of the field party (please remember to inform them if you later find the arrow).</p> <p>It is the archer's responsibility to account for all arrows before leaving the field.</p>
Photography	In line with the recommendation in the AGB Safeguarding Policy, those who wish to take photographs or video at this event are to register with the Tournament Organiser on arrival. Unauthorised photography is not permitted. Photos and videos taken at this event may be used by the Host Club across its communication channels to promote the sport. If you are concerned about any photography and videos taking place at this event, or do not wish to be photographed please contact the tournament organiser directly.
Refreshments	Hot and cold refreshments will be available all day, including breakfast, hot rolls, and a selection of cakes.
Special Note	<p>Please ensure that the organiser is aware of any special requirements you may have. Please do not assume that we already know.</p> <p>Archers who are unable to get to the target are requested, if possible, to arrange for an assistant to aid in scoring and arrow collection.</p> <p>If this is not possible, then please contact the organiser in advance of the tournament for advice.</p>
GDPR	<p>When you enter this competition, the following information may be collected and shared with Tournament Organisers, scoring systems and other competitors. For example target lists and results may be published:</p> <p>First Name, Surname, Gender, Bow Style, Archery GB number, Age Category, Club, Round, Disabled (Y/N). Junior Date of Birth is only used for selecting / checking the correct round shot. Contact information such as email, addresses &amp; phone numbers will not be published and only available to the Tournament Organiser to enable them to contact the archer if required to do so. The information supplied will be held no longer than two years after the event to enable the tournament organiser to send Results from that year, contact you the following year with the event information or for the return of any trophies won.</p>
Smoking	Outside the Club's boundaries. Please note that this rule also applies to those using electronic cigarettes.
Stoves & Burners	Please do not put stoves, burners or hot water urns directly on the grass.
Pets	Well behaved pets are welcome but must be kept on a lead and may be asked to leave the site if disrupting the event. Owners are expected to clean up any mess; non-compliance with this rule will result in your removal from the site.
Car Parking	If you require disabled parking (blue badge holders only) please notify us in advance of the tournament.
Disclaimer	Deer Park Archers will not take any responsibility for injury or any loss from, or damage to, any vehicle or equipment however caused. Entry to the tournament will be taken as acceptance of these conditions.
