Competition Information

Venue: Ballyclare Rugby Club, The Cloughan Lane, Doagh Road, BT39 9JD



Round: World Record Status Double WA70/60/50

The morning session will consist of 72 arrows split into 2 blocks of 36. The afternoon will repeat this format.

Anyone who is shooting the correct age groups will be eligible for records and awards. Archers may choose to shoot 'down' a category; however, they will be non-eligible for medals and awards. The event will be ran under World Archery Rules and Regulations. Archers should be familiar with these procedures.

Event Timings

Registration and Equipment Inspections- 9am

Assembly- 9:45am

Practice – 9:55am

Shooting Ends

Shooting will be in ends of six arrows with 3 minutes to shoot the arrows. The event will be controlled using the Danage Timing System.

The tournament will be controlled by the DoS (Director of Shooting) using the Danage timing system.

The Danage will use audio and visual signals to control the shooting. Archers need to be familiar with the below signals.

Red Light → Archers should not shoot

Amber Light → 30 seconds or less remaining on the time

Green Light → Archers are free to shoot

2 Blasts → Archers have 10 seconds to come to the line, they can load their arrow into the bow but cannot raise their bow arm to shoot

1 Blast → Archers can begin shooting

3 Blasts → Archers are to collect their arrows

5 Blasts → Emergency Stop, archers should stop shooting immediately



Membership

Archers must hold a valid Archery GB membership. Alternatively, members of World Archery affiliated bodies are welcome to shoot provided suitable insurance is provided. Archers should have evidence of their affiliation to AGB/ WA Body on the day of the competition, random inspections may be completed.

Entry

Entries will be taken via the Google Form. All entries must be submitted through the form. The Tournament Organiser has the right to refuse anyone entry to the competition. Entries will close Tuesday 4th June @ 11am. Entry to the competition will cost £10 for a Junior and £12 for a senior

Results

Results for the competition, including target allocations will be posted to ianse0. Results from the competition will be unofficial until the arrow-by-arrow verification of scorecards take place, once complete results will be official. Scorecards which are not signed for by the archer and the scorer will be disqualified. The failure to complete the 10 + X and X columns will result in a 0 score being awarded. Changing arrow values without a Judge correction will result in the loss of the arrow value. Should any archer be unclear on scorecard completion, a document can be found on ianse0 to assist.

Code of Conducts

Archery GB strive to have a welcoming and friendly atmosphere at all levels of competition, and for everyone attending to leave having enjoyed their day's competition. The TO and CoJ has the right to remove

anyone from the field of play.

Archery GB welcome encouragement and cheering in support of competing athletes, in a good sporting manner.

- We are asking all individuals to please think how you are behaving at events when supporting people.
 - Ask yourself what an acceptable way is to behave in a sporting environment.
- Please treat others as you would like to be treated yourself.
- When supporting people in matches please do so in good taste.
 - Please demonstrate good sportsmanship when supporting all athletes.
 - Examples of poor sportsmanship; the purposeful wrong calling of arrows or shouting loudly when an opponent is at full draw.

If you feel anyone is behaving in an inappropriate manner at any competition you are attending, inform either the Head Judge or the Tournament Organiser, (both should make themselves known at assembly) The CoJ and TO has the right to ask any person to leave the competition

MCoA Summer Series

This competition will be the last leg of the MCoA Outdoor Summer Series. Points will be awarded based on the positions. Archers who rank 1st will be awarded one point, 2nd will be awarded 2 points. The same will be completed for the match play. At the end of the series the person with the lowest points in Recurve, Compound, Barebow and Longbow will be presented with a trophy. Glass Medals for 1-3rd positions in the series will also be handed out.

Parking at Ballyclare RFC

Parking will be on the carpark on the right hand side as signalled on the map at the beginning of this document. Please park neatly and ensure not to block any vehicles in. The lane way which filters around to the left must be kept clear at all times as well as the gates leading to the pitches for emergency access.

When parked there is a short walk over a bank which will take you to the pitch.
