Event Format	The competition will consist of a Double 720 round shot to World Archery rules  Senior and U21 Recurve Archers will Shoot 70m on a 122cm Face. Recurve U18 and 50+ Archer will shoot 60m on a 122cm Face. Senior,50+, U21 and U18 Barebow Archers will shoot 50m at a 122cm Target. Compound Senior, 50+, U21 and U18 archers will use individual 6 zone 80cm face at 50m  Recurve U15 Archers will shoot 40m on a 122cm Target Face. Compound U15 Archers will shoot 40m on an 80cm Full Face. Barebow U15 Archers will shoot 30m on a 122cm Target Face. Visually Impaired Archers will shoot 30m on an 80cm Full Face. Longbow Archers will shoot 50m on a 122cm Target Face  This round to be shot in accordance with Archery GB and World Archery Rules of Shooting.  An archer may enter a round in a higher age group than their own, but not a lower age group. Should an archer wish to shoot 'down' an age group they will not be eligible for medals.		

	There will be a max of four archers per target. Most bosses are straw on tripod frames with a minimum of 1 layered foam boss.		
Awards	Medals will be awarded on the following basis in all disciplines for each competition:  1 - 2 entries - 1 <sup>st</sup> 3 - 4 entries - 2nd  5 or more entries - 3 <sup>rd</sup>		
GDPR	"When you enter competitions the following information may be collected and shared with tournament organisers, scoring systems and other competitors for example target lists and results may be published: First Name, Surname, Gender, Bow style, Date of Birth / Age category, Email, Address, Phone number, Club (and ID), County (and ID), Region (and ID), Round (unless defined by age), Disabled (Y/N), Disability info.		
Junior archers	All Junior archers (i.e. archers under the age of 18) must be accompanied by a parent/guardian for the duration of the event.

If you feel anyone is behaving in an inappropriate manner at any NICSAC competition you are attending, inform either the Chair of Judges or the Tournament Organiser, (both should make themselves known at assembly). The CoJ and TO has the right to ask any person to leave the field of play or the competition

Dress	Please refer to the Archery GB Rules of Shooting for the dress regulations 307 Archers should comply with dress regulations until after the presentations.		
Drug Testing	Please wear appropriate clothing for shooting outdoors.  Archers competing at record status tournaments may be liable for drugs testing.  Competitors who are approached to give samples must comply.  Non-compliance will be treated as a positive result.  Parents / Guardians must sign the relevant box on the entry forms giving consent for junior archers (Under 18's) to be drug tested if approached.		
Refreshments	Refreshments are not available at the venue.		
Photography	In line with the recommendation in the Archery GB Safeguarding Policy, those who wish to take photographs or video at this event are to register with the Tournament Organiser on arrival.  Unauthorised photography is not permitted.
