Competition Information

Venue: Burnside Barn, Moyra Road, Kilbride, BT39 0SQ



Round: UK Record Status Stafford

This will consist of 72 arrows shot on a 80cm Full Face for all bow styles except compound archers who have the choice to shoot an 80cm 6 ring face.

Anyone who is shooting the correct age groups will be eligible for records and awards. Archers may choose to shoot 'down' a category; however, they will be non-eligible for medals and awards. The event will be ran under World Archery Rules and Regulations. Archers should be familiar with these procedures.

Event Timings

Registration and Equipment Inspections- 9am/ 1pm

Assembly- 9: 45am/1.15pm

Practice – 9.55am / 3.30pm

Shooting Ends

Shooting will be in ends of three arrows with 2 minutes to shoot the arrows. The event will be controlled using the World Archery Timing System.

The tournament will be controlled by the DoS (Director of Shooting) using the World Archery timing system.

The Timing System will use audio and visual signals to control the shooting. Archers need to be familiar with the below signals.

Red Light → Archers should not shoot

Amber Light → 30 seconds or less remaining on the time

Green Light → Archers are free to shoot

2 Blasts → Archers have 10 seconds to come to the line, they can load their arrow into the bow but cannot raise their bow arm to shoot

1 Blast → Archers can begin shooting

3 Blasts → Archers are to collect their arrows

5 Blasts → Emergency Stop, archers should stop shooting immediately



Membership

Archers must hold a valid Archery GB membership. Alternatively, members of World Archery affiliated bodies are welcome to shoot provided suitable insurance is provided. Archers should have evidence of their affiliation to AGB/ WA Body on the day of the competition, random inspections may be completed.

Entry

Entries will be taken via the Google Form. All entries must be submitted through the form. The Tournament Organiser has the right to refuse anyone entry to the competition. Entries will close Wednesday 18th February @ noon. Entry to the competition will cost £8 for a Junior and £10 for a senior for a single session. Junior will cost £13 for a double session and £17 for a senior shooting both sessions.

Results

Results for the competition, including target allocations will be posted to ianseo. Results from the competition will be unofficial until the arrow-by-arrow verification of scorecards take place, once complete results will be official. Scorecards which are not signed for by the archer and the scorer will be disqualified. The failure to complete the Golds and Hits columns will result in a 0 score being awarded. Changing arrow values without a Judge correction will result in the loss of the arrow value. Should any archer be unclear on scorecard completion, a document can be found on ianseo to assist. In the event of a tie in scores, archers will be separate by hits, golds and should this not be resolved if possible, a shoot off will be conducted, failing this the archer with the most amount of 9s will be awarded the higher position.

Code of Conducts

Archery GB strive to have a welcoming and friendly atmosphere at all levels of competition, and for everyone attending to leave having enjoyed their day's competition. The TO and CoJ has the right to remove anyone from the field of play.

Archery GB welcome encouragement and cheering in support of competing athletes, in a good sporting manner.

- We are asking all individuals to please think how you are behaving at events when supporting people.
- Ask yourself what an acceptable way is to behave in a sporting environment.
- Please treat others as you would like to be treated yourself.
- When supporting people in matches please do so in good taste.
- Please demonstrate good sportsmanship when supporting all athletes.

- o Examples of poor sportsmanship; the purposeful wrong calling of arrows or shouting loudly when an opponent is at full draw.

If you feel anyone is behaving in an inappropriate manner at any competition you are attending, inform either the Head Judge or the Tournament Organiser, (both should make themselves known at assembly) The CoJ and TO has the right to ask any person to leave the competition

Parking at the Burnside Barn

When parking at the barn please be considerate that access is required to the fields and sheds that, surround the venue. Please ensure these are accessible at all times. There should be no cars parked on the lane way this must be kept clear in case of emergencies. Failure to comply will result in you being asked to remove your car.

Pass Throughs

Should you be concerned, you will pass through the target please feel free to bring your own target nappy.

Music

Music will be played throughout the competition; the volume of the music will be adjusted when shooting.

GDPR

When you enter competitions the following information may be collected and shared with tournament organisers, scoring systems and other competitors for example target lists and results may be published: First Name, Surname, Gender, Bow style, Date of Birth / Age category, Email, Address, Phone number, Club (and ID), County (and ID), Region (and ID), Round (unless defined by age), Disabled (Y/N), Disability info.

Junior Archers

Archers who are under the age of 18 must get their parent to complete the entry form on their behalf. The parents email address must be entered. Any u18S must be always supervised throughout the competition.
