Round Format

This tournament will be shot as a World Record Status Double WA70/60/50/40/30.

Archers competing in their correct age category will be eligible for records, awards, and medals. Archers may elect to compete in an older age category; however, they will not be eligible for medals, awards, or records within that category.

The tournament will be conducted in accordance with the current World Archery Rules and Regulations. Competitors are expected to be familiar with these rules and procedures prior to the event.

A schedule of events will be posted to lanseo, the Judging team will advise accordingly of any schedule changes.

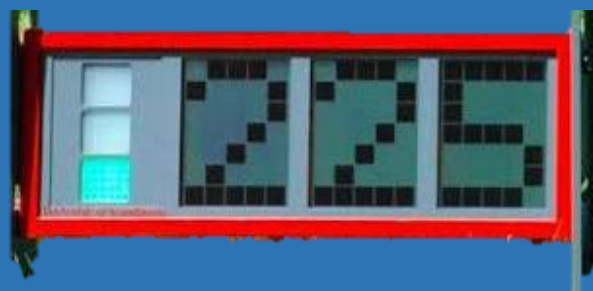
Shooting Procedure

The competition will be shot in ends of six arrows, with three minutes permitted per end.

The tournament will be controlled by the Director of Shooting (DoS) using the Danage Timing System.

The Danage timing system will use both visual and audible signals to control shooting. All competitors should familiarise themselves with the following signals:

Signal	Meaning
Red Light	Archers must not shoot
Amber Light	30 seconds or less remaining
Green Light	Archers may shoot
Two Blasts	Archers have 10 seconds to approach the shooting line. An arrow may be loaded, but the bow must not be raised.
One Blast	Shooting may commence
Three Blasts	Collect arrows
Five Blasts	Emergency stop – cease shooting immediately



Membership

All competitors must hold a valid Archery GB membership. Members of other World Archery affiliated Member Associations are welcome to compete, provided they hold suitable insurance cover.

Archers must be able to provide proof of membership and/or affiliation on the day of the tournament. Random membership checks may be carried out.

Entry Information

Entries will be accepted via the official Google Entry Form only.

All entries must be submitted through the online entry system. The Tournament Organiser reserves the right to refuse any entry.

Results

Target allocations and results will be published through lanseo.

Results will remain unofficial until all scorecards have undergone arrow-by-arrow verification. Once verification has been completed, results will be declared official.

Scorecards must be signed by both the archer and the scorer. Unsigned scorecards may be disqualified.

Failure to complete the 10s and Xs columns will result in a score of zero being recorded for those values.

Any alteration of arrow values without a Judge's authorisation will result in the loss of the affected arrow value.

Code of Conducts

Archery GB strive to have a welcoming and friendly atmosphere at all levels of competition, and for everyone attending to leave having enjoyed their day's competition. The TO and CoJ has the right to remove anyone from the field of play.

Archery GB welcome encouragement and cheering in support of competing athletes, in a good sporting manner.

- We are asking all individuals to please think how you are behaving at events when supporting people.
- Ask yourself what an acceptable way is to behave in a sporting environment.
- Please treat others as you would like to be treated yourself.
- When supporting people in matches please do so in good taste.
- Please demonstrate good sportsmanship when supporting all athletes.
- o Examples of poor sportsmanship; the purposeful wrong calling of arrows or shouting loudly when an opponent is at full draw.

If you feel anyone is behaving in an inappropriate manner at any competition you are attending, inform either the Head Judge or the Tournament Organiser, (both should make themselves known at assembly) The CoJ and TO has the right to ask any person to leave the competition

Music

Background music may be played throughout the competition. The volume will be kept at a low level and is intended to enhance the event atmosphere without disrupting competitors.

MCoA Perpetual Trophy

The MCoA Perpetual Trophies for the three recognised World Archery bow styles will be awarded based on the cumulative scores achieved across the four Summer Series events.

The archer with the highest accumulated score in each eligible bow style at the conclusion of the series will be presented with the respective perpetual trophy.
