Introduction

The 2026 Indoor Weekend comprises of two round types, 1 AGB Portsmouth and 3 WA 18m rounds.

There are eight championships taking place over the weekend. They are:

Junior & U21 Championships	Novice Championships
Disability Championships	50+ Championships
Senior Barebow Championships	
Senior Longbow Championships	
Senior Recurve Championships	
Senior Compound Championships	

Some of the championships occur at the same time so are the same round, you need to decide which category you want to enter for each of the championships, you cannot be in both at the same time.

The intention is that there should be at least one championship for every archer to take part in.

We encourage archers to enter as many rounds as possible as this gives the opportunity to:

- ✓ Achieve selection scores for squads and events where you will be able to represent your country.
- ✓ Demonstrate your commitment to competitive archery and gain experience
- ✓ Obtain Scottish Archery indoor ranking scores
- ✓ Obtain Archery GB classification scores
- ✓ Challenge yourself, while in a controlled environment. Competition PB's are the ones to have.
- ✓ Meetup with friends and form new friendships
- ✓ Partake in the enjoyment of archery

Everyone can take part in each competition, its nice to have a full hall buzzing with lots of archers, awards will be based on the definition in the following section, but remember its not always about winning.



Entries

Entries will be done on a first come first serve basis and only when payment has been made.

Entries will be taken on Just Go, therefore no entry will be made or accepted unless payment is made at the same time. Entries not on Just Go will not be accepted.

Entry Dates

Closing Date: **13th March 2026**.

No modifications or corrections will be allowed after **20th March 2026**.

Bosses

Layered foam bosses or Danage bosses on H frames will be used.

Dress Code

Archers must comply with Archery GB dress regulations (Rule 307).

Photography

In view of the provisions of the SAA Protection of Children and Vulnerable Adults policy, those who wish to take videos or photographs at this event are asked to register their details online via the QR code displayed.

If parents/carers have any concerns about their child or young person being photographed or filmed, they should inform the Competition Manager.

This year, a QR code will be displayed around the venue for you to submit your details to take photographs instead of the written paper version previously used.

Anti-Doping

Archers competing at the tournament may be asked to provide a sample for anti-doping and competitors approached to give samples must comply. Refusal to be tested will be treated as a positive result. Junior entries (under 18) must be accompanied by a parent or guardian, who must give consent for anti-doping test to be conducted, if approached.

Data Protection

When you enter competitions the following information may be collected and shared with Tournament Organisers, scoring systems and other competitors for example target lists and results may be published: First Name, Surname, Gender, Bow style, Date of Birth/Age category, Email, Address, Phone number, Club (and ID), County (and ID), Region (and ID), Round (unless defined by age), Disabled (Y/N), Disability info.

Divisions

This year there will be two divisions that an athlete can enter. These being Women and Open.

Female Category: This category is for those participants recorded female at birth.

Open Category: This category is open to all including those participants recorded male at birth, recorded female at birth (regardless of whether they have undergone hormone therapy), and those who identify as transgender or non-binary.

Age Groups

An archer may compete in a junior age group where the Tournament takes place up to and in the year of their birthday prior to the limit on the category. (e.g., if they turned 17 in a year, they can compete in an U18 category, but they cannot turn 18 in the year)

An archer may compete in the 50+ division when the competition takes place in the year of their 50th Birthday and thereafter.

Competition Documentation

All documentation will be published on Ianseo and on the Scottish Archery website.

The final target list will be published on the evening of Friday 13th March with a final amended target list published nearer the time.

The entrants list will be updated weekly and will be available on Ianseo, please let the Competition Manager know if there are any mistakes.

Registration

All membership cards must be shown during registration. Should you not be in possession of your 2025/26 Archery GB Membership card, please bring proof that your membership has been paid to your Club/SAA/Archery GB.

Scoring / Results

Double scoring will be used throughout the weekend. There will be one paper scorecard and one electronic PDA.

Live scoring will be used and results published to Ianseo. Full championship results will be published after the completion of each session.

Smoking

Smoking is not permitted in any Stirling University buildings.

Facilities

There is a canteen on site. Please ensure you take all rubbish away with you at the end of the session.

Eligibility to be Scottish Champion

To become Scottish Champion, you need to fulfil the eligibility criteria as laid out in the Scottish National Team Eligibility Criteria 2024 document which states that:

To be eligible to shoot for the Scotland National Team, one or more of the following must apply to you:

- *You were born in Scotland OR*
- *You have at least one parent or grandparent born in Scotland OR*
- *You have been a continuous resident in Scotland for 2 years or more*

As well as the above, you must also be a registered Scottish Archery Member.




*** - Novice athletes are those who have shot for less than two years in any archery discipline.**
Those entering as an adult (not a novice) will not be awarded any medals in this event.

Disability and 50+ Championships

Disability & 50+ Classes

To be classed as disabled for the purposes of the championships, you must either possess a World Archery or Archery GB classification card or consider yourself to have a disability. To compete in the 50 division, you must be turning 50 in 2026 or have already turned 50 in a previous year.

Should numbers allow, Men and Women will compete in different categories. Otherwise, they will compete as one category.




W1

To be classed as a W1 athlete, you usually have some form of impairment in both the top and bottom halves of your torso.

You should also have impairment in at least three of your limbs

Open

To be classed as an open athlete, you usually have an impairment in either the top **or** bottom half **or** one side of your body.



Visually Impaired

To shoot as a Visually Impaired athlete (VI), you usually have a significant impairment that is not correctable with any lens. Those wishing to compete in the VI category must comply with the equipment rules for VI equipment as laid out in the Archery GB Rules of shooting.

Unclassified

This is for anyone who has a disability but does not fit into any of the above categories.






Please note That you can only enter either the Disability **OR** the 50+ championships. Those who have a disability and are 50+ must chose to shoot in one of the two championships.







Trophies Won by Scottish Champions


The trophies that are won by Scottish Champions, are not to be kept and will be used at every Indoor Weekend in the future.
