Event Timings	<p>Morning Assembly 9.45am approx. followed by 2 ends of sighters.</p> <p>Afternoon Assembly 13.45pm approx. followed by 2 ends of sighters for archers competing in the afternoon session only.</p> <p>The awards ceremony will be on completion of both sessions.</p>
Event Format	<p>Double Portsmouth round to be shot in accordance with Archery GB Rules of Shooting. There will be a max of four archers per target.</p> <p>Shooting will be in ends of three arrows with 2 minutes to shoot the arrows. The event will be controlled using either the Archery Clock or Chronotir Timing System.</p> <p>Compounds can shoot at individual Triple Spot target faces or they can shoot at a 60cm face if they wish to try for the Robin Hood prize.</p> <p>Compound archers will have the opportunity for a 15 minute session at Lunchtime to try for the Robin Hood prize if it has not already been claimed.</p> <p>All other bow styles will shoot at 60cm target face.</p> <p>Most bosses are straw on tripod frames. There will be 2 x Foam bosses.</p>

Awards	Medals for 1st, 2nd & 3rd place, Gents, Ladies & Juniors for the Double round only.

Dress	Please refer to the Archery GB Rules of Shooting for the dress regulations 307 Archers should comply with dress regulations until after the presentations. Please wear sports shoes in the hall.
Drug Testing	Archers competing at record status tournaments may be liable for drugs testing. It is the archers responsibility to ensure that they have checked the updated UKAD banned substance list for 2024. Competitors who are approached to give samples must comply. Non-compliance will be treated as a positive result. Parents / Guardians must sign the relevant box on the entry forms giving consent for junior archers (Under 18’s) to be drug tested if approached.
Refreshments	Refreshments are not available at the venue.
Photography	In line with the recommendation in the Archery GB Safeguarding Policy, those who wish to take photographs or video at this event are to register with the Tournament Organiser on arrival. Unauthorised photography is not permitted.
Special Note	Archers who are unable to get to the target should arrange for an assistant to aid in scoring and arrow collection. Please advise the TO and CoJ on arrival.
Car Parking	Free limited parking will be available within the venue. Please park responsibly and not block and emergency access points.
Dogs	No dogs, except guide dogs are permitted in the hall
Smoking	Please use the designated smoking area provided, including E cigs
