Eligibility	This competition is open to individuals affiliated to Archery GB or a World Archery member association. Please bring proof of membership (e.g. Archery GB Membership Card).
Age Groups	Archery GB age groups: Men/Open, Women Juniors may enter this competition but must shoot as seniors
Bow Types	Barebow, Compound, Longbow, Recurve.
Judges	Mr Adam Doughty (Head Judge), Mr Gary Jones

Distance Class (Round to be shot)	Double American (UK Record Status) A single American (60yds, 50yds, 40yds) round will be shot in the morning with a further single American round shot in the afternoon. <i>Junior archers are welcome to take part, but they will be shooting the full American round distances. Juniors wishing to enter will pay the full senior entry fee.</i>
Registration	Registration opens at 08:30hrs with assembly at 09:15hrs.
Bow Inspection	Judge will inspect archers' equipment from 09:00hrs.
Practice	Archers will have six sighters. Sighters will be at 09:30hrs for the morning round and 13:00hrs for the afternoon round.
Event Format	Targets are layered foam with 122cm target faces. Archery GB Imperial Outdoor Rounds 5 Zone Scoring. The maximum number of archers on a target shall be four. The archers on each target shall be designated A-B, C-D, in the order in which they appear on the target list. The order of shooting at all record status competitions shall rotate. Archers will shoot ends of six arrows under Method 2 of the Rules of Shooting - timed ends controlled by audible signals supplemented with lights and countdown timing clocks.
Entry Fee	£22 payable by card upon submission of the on-line registration form. Note: we only accept card payments.
Entry Information	Entries must be submitted by completing the online Registration Form Disabled archers who are unable to get to the target, please try and arrange your own assistant to aid in scoring and arrow collection. If this is not possible, please ensure you have ticked the appropriate box on the registration form, and the Tournament Officer will arrange assistance.
Closing Date for Entries	24 th May 2026 or when full. Entries after the closing date will not be accepted.
Refunds and Cancellations	If you wish to cancel your space and get a refund, please contact the Tournament Officer at: tournaments@croesoswalltarchers.co.uk Up to 14 days before the event, a 50% refund will be issued. After the 14-day deadline, no refund will be issued.
Target List, Scoring & Results	Event notifications will be published at www.croesoswalltarchers.co.uk All scoring will be on paper scoresheets, with scores entered onto the i@nseo software for managing archery tournament results. Target lists and results will be published on www.ianseo.net , and www.croesoswalltarchers.co.uk . A target list will be available on www.croesoswalltarchers.co.uk and www.ianseo.net seven days before the tournament.
Awards	A special commemorative Silver Dollar trophy will be awarded for 1st place, club medals for 2 nd and 3 rd places, per competition category (open/female) and division (bow style). <i>Juniors may enter this competition but must shoot as seniors. There will be no separate junior awards.</i>

<p>Rules and Dress Code</p>	<p>Archery GB Rules of Shooting will apply. Only clothing in compliance with Rule 307 will be permitted. Blue Denim, Olive Drab and Camouflage are not allowed. Archer's names, manufacturers logos, club logos and sponsors logos are allowed. The only other wording or logos permissible must represent archery organisations. The tournament organisers have the right to exclude any persons from the field for unreasonable behaviour. The Judge is responsible for the safe conduct of the shoot at all times and the Judge's decision is final and must be obeyed.</p>
<p>Anti-doping (UKRS Events Only)</p>	<p>Archers competing at record status competitions may be subject to anti-doping testing. Competitors who are approached to give samples must comply. Non-compliance will be treated as a positive result. By entering this competition, you consent to anti-doping testing. If you are entering a minor into this competition you consent to the testing of that minor. This is in line with UK Anti-Doping Policy, Rule 5.7.2.</p>
<p>Lost Arrows</p>	<p>All arrows must be accounted for. In accordance with Archery GB rules, searches for lost arrows must not delay shooting. Searches for lost arrows may continue after completion of the competition when the work party may assist. Lost arrows must be reported to a Judge or the Tournament Organiser (please remember to inform them if you later find the arrow). It is the archer's responsibility to account for all arrows before leaving the field. It would be advantageous if all carbon arrows were fitted with pin nocks, as this would assist when searching for potential lost arrows.</p>
<p>Data Protection</p>	<p>By entering this competition, you agree that information may be collected and shared with tournament organisers, scoring systems, Archery GB and other competitors. The information collected includes: name, gender, bow style, age category, date of birth (if junior), club, round, disability information, e-mail, and contact telephone number. Some information may also be published on www.archerygb.org, www.ianseo.net, and www.croesoswalltarchers.co.uk in the form of target lists and results: name, gender, bow style, age category, date of birth (if junior), club, round, disabled (Y/N).</p>
<p>Photography</p>	<p>In line with the recommendation in the Archery GB Safeguarding Policy, those who wish to take photographs or video at this event are to register with the Tournament Officer on arrival. Unauthorised photography is not permitted. Entrants bringing visitors to the competition are asked to make them aware of this requirement. Photos and video taken at this event by Croesoswallt Archers official photographer may be used by the club on its website and social media platforms to promote the club and sport. If you are concerned about any photography and videos taking place at this event, or do not wish to be photographed, please contact the Tournament Officer. You can request photos to be taken off Croesoswallt Archers website and social media platforms if you do not wish them to be displayed.</p>
<p>Juniors</p>	<p>All competitors under the age of 18 must be supervised by a parent, guardian or other nominated responsible adult.</p>
<p>Parking</p>	<p>There is plenty of parking near the shooting field. Please ensure that you park within the designated areas or were instructed to by the parking stewards.</p>
<p>Line Tents</p>	<p>Line tents are permitted for this event and must be sited in the marked areas. Line tents may be erected from 08:00 hrs.</p>
<p>Toilets</p>	<p>Unisex chemical toilets are available on the Croesoswallt Archers Ground. Please keep these tidy.</p>
<p>Smoking and Alcohol</p>	<p>Alcohol and smoking, including e-cigarettes and vaping, is NOT permitted anywhere on the Croesoswallt Archers Ground. The smoking area is beyond the fence surrounding the Croesoswallt Archers Ground. Please ensure that you take your rubbish home with you.</p>
<p>Refreshments</p>	<p>Food and drink will be available during the shoot, with sausage & bacon baps in the morning and beef burgers at lunchtime, plus tea, coffee, and cold drinks. Payment is cash only.</p>
<p>Stoves and Burners</p>	<p>Please be aware that no naked flames (e.g. camping stoves) are permitted anywhere on site.</p>

<p>Pets</p>	<p>Assistance dogs are permitted on the Croesoswallt Archers Ground.</p> <p>Dogs which are not considered to be assistance dogs are only permitted with the prior agreement of the Tournament Officer.</p> <p>Dog owners should be aware that not all people are comfortable being around dogs and therefore it is the obligation of the dog owner to always maintain the dog on a short (non-extendable) lead, keep the dog behind the Tent Line and clear up their own dog's mess.</p> <p>The presence of a dog should not have any impact on others and their shooting ability, nor the overall safety or enjoyment of the event.</p> <p>If any dog causes issues, displays inappropriate or disruptive behaviour then the Tournament Officer or Judge are within their capacity to ask the owner to remove the dog from the Croesoswallt Archers Ground.</p>
<p>Safeguarding</p>	<p>The Welfare Officer's information is available on www.croesoswalltarchers.co.uk.</p> <p>The British Ironwork Centre is not open to the public on the day of the competition.</p> <p>Any concerns of suspicious activity should be raised with the Welfare Officer on the day.</p> <p>All children must be supervised by their parent, guardian or other nominated responsible adult.</p>
<p>Camping</p>	<p>Camping is not available at the British Ironwork Centre. There are several camping sites nearby (links below).
