



# Meriden Archery Club

## Spring WA Double 720

### Sunday 12 April 2026

#### 1. Format:

- Morning: World Record Status WA 720 round 1 at 70m recurve, 60m recurve and 50m compound/barebow. Compound targets will have one 6-ring face per archer, whilst all other targets will have one 10-ring face per target.
- Afternoon: World Record Status WA 720 round 2.

#### 2. Rounds:

- Adults: 70m recurve / 50m Compound / 50m Barebow.
- Under 18's: 60m Recurve / 50m Compound.
- Over 50's and under 21's are welcome to take part but there are no separate age categories.
- 6 arrow ends in 4 minutes.
- Timing will be controlled by the judges using a Chronotir Timing system.
- There will be a short break after 36 arrows in each round.

#### 3. Timings:

- Strictly no access or entry before 07:30 am.
- Equipment inspection by bow type/entry category in various locations along the shooting line 08:00 – 08:45 am. Inspection will act as registration too.
- Assembly: 08:45 am followed by two ends of official practice.

#### 4. Judges:

- Chair of Judges: Andy Stanford.
- Other Judges to be confirmed.

- Entries open December 8 2025.
- Entry Fee: £22 before January 31 2026. £24 from February 1 2026.
- 80% refund up to midnight March 28 2026.
- A waiting list will operate from the point that the tournament becomes full. If a space becomes available you will be invited by email.

#### 6. Closing Date:

- March 29 2026 at midday or when full.

## 7. Car Parking:

- Parking adjacent to the Clubhouse is reserved for Judges, Officials and Disabled archers.
- Limited parking is available within the grounds of the club. Please park where directed by Club Officials on the day. Do not park within hatched areas.
- When all car parking spaces are full on the Club grounds please park on the road outside the club.
- Please do not leave the Club grounds on foot or by car when shooting is in progress as it can distract the archers. Please wait for a break in shooting to exit the grounds.

## 8. Miscellaneous entry information:

- Please state if you have any specific requirements on the entry form.
- Archers who are unable to collect, pull and/or score arrows should bring a helper with them who can do this for them. Please confirm on the entry form if you will be doing this.

## 9. Awards:

- Medals will be awarded to first, second and third place in each entry category. However, the number of medals awarded is dependent on the number of entries per entry category.
- Medals will be presented as soon as possible after the tournament ends.

## 10. Target List and Results:

- Target list will be available 48hours beforehand, and results will be displayed 24 hours after the event on <https://www.ianseo.net>

## 11. ArcheryGB Compliance:

- ArcheryGB dress regulations as shown in Rule 307 will apply and is open to any archer currently affiliated to AGB.

## 12. Contact:

## 13. Photography:

- By entering this competition you agree that photographs and/or video may be taken at the event.
- Please contact the TO directly if you do not wish to be included in any photo.
- Anyone wishing to use video or photographic equipment at this tournament must register at the judges hut on the day prior to the tournament starting.

## 14. Other info:

- Tents are permitted and can be put up between 5-7 pm only on the day before the competition. Do not pitch over the hatched areas in order to keep access to the field clear. Overnight camping or practice is not permitted.

- Food and Drink: Hot and cold drinks, along with a selection of cold food (cakes, pastries, etc.) will be available in the clubhouse from 08:00 am. If possible please bring your own cup to reduce the waste. Hot food will not be provided.
- Toilets: Male, female and disabled toilets are provided.
- Dogs: are permitted but must be kept on a lead at all times.
- Smoking, including vapes, is only permitted on the other side of the road behind the tent line.
- Music will be played throughout the tournament.
- Drug testing: World Record Status shoots are liable for drug testing and any competitors approached to give samples must comply. If they refuse, that refusal will be treated as a positive result. By entering an under 18 athlete, the parent (or guardian) confirms and accepts that they consent to their child being tested if approached.
- Data Protection/GDPR: By entering the event, you agree that information may be collected and shared with tournament organisers, scoring systems, ArcheryGB and other competitors. Some information may also be published in documents or lists relating to the event to a schedule decided by the organisers. These include the entrant's name, gender, bow style, age category, round disability information, email addresses and/or contact numbers provided, club, county, region and any assigned codes for this information.
- Liability: Meriden Archery Club will not accept responsibility for any loss, damage or injury, however caused, either before, during or after the event.
- If you are no longer able to attend the tournament we ask you email the Tournament Officer as soon as possible prior to the tournament starting.
