Event Format	Compound archers will shoot a WA18m round on a vertical 3-spot 40cm face. Recurve, barebow and longbow archers will shoot on a 40cm full face with the option to shoot a vertical 3-spot 40cm face. Those archers choosing to shoot 3-spot will be included alongside those shooting full face for awards.		
Registration & Equipment inspection	Registration from 7.30am. Proof of current AGB membership will be required for registration. Equipment inspection will be carried out prior to the start of practice.		
Event Timings	Session 1 – 08:45 (two ends of practice, with scoring commencing immediately afterwards) Session 2 – 11:45 (two ends of practice, with scoring commencing immediately afterwards) Session 3 – 14:45 (two ends of practice, with scoring commencing immediately afterwards)		
Awards	Trophies and medals will be awarded based on the number of archers competing in each category. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Juniors wishing to compete for senior awards must enter as a senior archer. • Parental signature and Date of Birth information is still required. Trophy for the top team of three from the same club (at least one lady or junior, no more than one compound)		
Shooting Rules	The tournament will be shot to World Archery rules in force at the time of the event.		
Dress regulations	Please refer to Archery GB's rules of shooting for dress regulations (rule 307 will apply). Archers should comply with dress regulations until after the presentations.		
Photography	In line with Archery GB policy, anyone wishing to take video or photographs during the event must register their details with tournament organiser. If parents/carers have any concerns about their child/young person being photographed or filmed they should notify the organisers. The organisers reserve the right to decline entry to any person unable to meet or abide by these conditions.		
Refreshments	Tea, coffee and squash will be available free of charge.		
Bosses	Tenzone layered foam targets.		
Special Note	Please ensure that the organiser is aware of any special requirements you may have. Archers who are unable to get to the target are requested, if possible, to arrange for an agent to aid in scoring and arrow collection. If this is not possible, please contact the organiser for advice.		
Smoking	As the tournament is held on school premises, smoking is not permitted anywhere and those wishing to smoke should do so off site. Please note this rule also applies to those using electronic cigarettes or vaping.		
Pets	Animals, other than assistance animals such as guide dogs, are not permitted.		

Parking	Parking is available at the event. Those with limited mobility should contact the organisers in advance to discuss parking options.
Documentation	Target lists, results and other instructions will be available via ianseo.net and the Peacock Archers website (peacock-archers.org).
Entry Fees	Fee £16 per session. Places only confirmed with payment. A waiting list will be in operation as soon as all places have been filled. Eventbrite entries include a small (non-refundable) booking fee.
Closing Date	Midnight on the 18 th of January 2026 or when full. Refunds no later than 30 days prior to the event.
