Criteria	Archers Competing for Heritage Trophies (<i>In Distance</i>) Senior Archer (Aged 18+) Senior archers competing for the Historic Heritage tournament trophies are required to have their current outdoor handicap declared at the first entry to a Heritage competition whether it is the actual first in the series or a subsequent competition. To provide for a transparent level of competitive fairness, Senior archers should shoot the distance category relative to their handicap achievement (<i>In Distance</i>). These rules do not apply to Junior archers, unless a Junior chooses to compete as a Senior. The different distances shot by Junior archers, according to age, act as a handicap system, thereby making all Junior scores comparable. Junior archers should shoot the distance category (<i>In Distance</i>) relative to their age based on the table below. 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Disability	Archers Competing for Disabled Heritage Trophies To qualify for the Disabled category, an archer must be registered as disabled with Archery GB. There will not be a requirement for the archer to disclose their disability. Disabled archers can compete in shorter distance <i>National</i> rounds should they feel their condition affects their ability to shoot in their age-appropriate category. A <i>National 30</i> round is the shortest distance a disabled archer can shoot if they wish to compete for a trophy in the Disabled category.												
Out of Distance	Archers Not Competing for Trophies (<i>Out of Distance</i>) Archers not shooting in the correct distance category (excluding disabled archers) based on their handicap for Seniors or age for Juniors are designated as shooting <i>Out of Distance</i>. Archers shooting <i>Out of Distance</i> MUST declare their current handicap on the entry form. If an archer does not have or doesn't declare their handicap, then the score they achieve will not be eligible for a medal.

Registration	Registration opens at 11:00 with assembly at 11:45.
Practice	Archers will have six sighters. Sighters will be at 12:00.
Event Format	Targets are layered foam with 122cm target faces. Archery GB Imperial Outdoor Rounds 5 Zone Scoring. The maximum number of archers on a target shall be four. The archers on each target shall be designated A-B, C-D, in the order in which they appear on the target list. Rotation shall be optional (Judge's decision). Archers will shoot ends of six arrows under Method 2 of the Rules of Shooting - timed ends controlled by audible signals.
Entry Fee	Senior £10, Junior £6 (Juniors wishing to shoot in the senior age class must pay the senior fee), payable by card upon submission of the on-line registration form. Note: we only accept card payments.
Entry Information	Entries must be submitted by completing the Sport80 entry form. Any archers with issues registering through Sport80 please email the TO. Disabled archers who are unable to get to the target, please try and arrange your own assistant to aid in scoring and arrow collection. If this is not possible, please ensure you have ticked the appropriate box on the registration form, and the Tournament Officer will arrange assistance.
Closing Date for Entries	27th July 2026 Entries after the closing date will not be accepted.
Target List, Scoring & Results	Scoring will be on paper scoresheets and electronic PDAs, with scores entered onto the ianseo software for managing archery tournament results. Target lists and results will be published on ianseo.net. A target list will be available on ianseo.net three days before the tournament.
Awards	For archers shooting in the correct distance category, club medals will be awarded to 1st, 2nd and 3rd places in each category, e.g. Recurve Open Long National. For archers shooting in the Disabled category, club medals will be awarded to 1st, 2nd and 3rd places in each category, e.g. Compound Female Disabled National 30 For archers not shooting in the correct distance category (<i>Out of Distance</i>), one set of club medals (1st, 2nd, and 3rd) will be awarded to Senior participants and a

	separate set to Junior participants, as adjusted scores will be used to compare archers within each group.
Rules and Dress Code	Archery GB Rules of Shooting will apply. Only clothing in compliance with Rule 307 will be permitted. Blue Denim, Olive Drab and Camouflage are not allowed. Archer's names, manufacturers logos, club logos and sponsors logos are allowed. The only other wording or logos permissible must represent archery organisations. The tournament organisers have the right to exclude any persons from the field for unreasonable behaviour. The Judge is responsible for the safe conduct of the shoot at all times and the Judge's decision is final and must be obeyed.
Data Protection	By entering this competition, you agree that information may be collected and shared with tournament organisers, scoring systems, Archery GB and other competitors. The information collected includes name, category, bow style, age class, date of birth (if junior), club, round, disability information, e-mail, and contact telephone number. Some information may also be published on archerygb.org ianseo.net bowbrook-archers.co.uk and shropshirearcherysociety.co.uk in the form of target lists and results: name, bow style, age class, club, round, disabled (Y/N).
Photography	In line with the recommendation in the Archery GB Safeguarding Policy, those who wish to take photographs or video at this event are to register with the Tournament Officer on arrival. Entrants bringing visitors to the competition are asked to make them aware of this requirement. Photos and video taken at this event by Bowbrook Archers photographers may be used by the club on its website and social media platforms to promote the club and sport. If you are concerned about any photography and videos taking place at this event, or do not wish to be photographed, please contact the Tournament Officer.
Juniors	All competitors under the age of 18 must be supervised by a parent, guardian or other nominated responsible adult.
Parking	There is plenty of parking near the shooting field. Please ensure that you park within the designated areas or were instructed to by the parking steward.
Line Tents	Line tents are permitted for this event and must be sited in the marked areas.

Toilets	Unisex toilets are available in the clubhouse. Please keep these tidy.
Smoking and Alcohol	Alcohol and smoking, including e-cigarettes and vaping, is NOT permitted anywhere in Bowbrook Archers. The smoking area is beyond the fence surrounding Bowbrook Archers.
Refreshments	Light buffet in the afternoon. Tea, coffee and squash will be available from 11:00.
Safeguarding	The Welfare Officer's contact information is available on bowbrook-archers.co.uk . Any concerns of activity should be raised with the Welfare Officer on the day. All children must be supervised by their parent, guardian or other nominated responsible adult.
