1. Introduction

1.1 About this document

This booklet contains the operational, technical and logistical information team managers need before and during the Hyundai World Archery Para Series, Ahmedabad. It complements the Invitation Package (v2.0, 3 July 2026), which remains the reference for entries, fees and registration.

It is not a substitute for the rules. For full regulations refer to the World Archery Constitution and Rules — Book 1, Book 2, Book 3 (Target Archery) Book 5 and Book 5.1 and the World Archery Para Archery rules. Where this booklet and the rules differ, the rules apply.

1.2 Key principles

- All athletes and team officials are reminded to respect the principles of fair play, non-violence and proper conduct at all times. Compliance with the World Archery betting, anti-corruption and anti-doping regulations is mandatory (Book 1).
- Please use the litter bins provided on the competition field, the practice range and all common areas. Each participant receives bottled water; empty bottles go in the bins behind the athletes' tents so the field stays clean and safe.
- This is a non-smoking event. Smoking, including electronic cigarettes, is forbidden inside public buildings and in all competition and training areas (Book 3, Art. 10.8). Designated smoking areas are indicated at the venue.

3.4 Practice

- Training field: **open from Friday 4 September** at the Sabarmati Riverfront, opposite the Event Centre — approximately 30 minutes from the official hotel. Transport is provided at no cost.
- Official practice: Saturday 5 September, 2026.
- Athletes must shoot on their assigned positions
- The practice field is located to the right of the main field of play used for qualification.
- **The practice field is CLOSED during the lunch break every day.**
- Daily practice field opening hours: **08:30 - 13:45**
- Non-competing athletes may use the practice field while qualification and elimination rounds are in progress.

3.5 Qualification (Ranking) Round

- **3 ends of 4 minutes practice (40 seconds per arrow)** on the field of play, immediately following once the field is reset. Shooting is in AB format.
- 70 m / 50 m/30 m Round — 72 arrows, at the distances and target faces set out in section 3.1.
- **No make-up arrows.** No allowance is made during the qualification round for equipment failure or for the treatment of medical problems.
- Points are allocated on the total score for the 72-arrow qualification before any tie-breaking rule is applied.

3.6 Elimination and finals rounds

- Target faces will **NOT** be changed after practice arrows. Please instruct your athletes to mark all arrow holes during practice and competition.
- **3 arrows per end of 120 seconds** (40 seconds per arrow).
- Matches at the start of each session begin on time; following matches start as soon as the field is ready. Athletes should be prepared for matches to start earlier than scheduled.
- For eliminations up to the semi-finals, shooting is simultaneous.
- The set system is used for all individual, doubles and mixed team matches in Para Recurve and W1. Compound divisions are shot on cumulative score.
- In case of a bye, athletes may shoot on their own target if the schedule allows. No score is recorded or displayed, and the Director of Shooting's timing and signals must be respected. Recurve athletes shooting a bye are permitted 3 sets of 3 arrows per end.

3.7 Doubles and mixed team rounds

- The doubles event is run in the same way as the mixed team event. During eliminations both teams shoot at the same time; finals are shot with alternate shooting.
- Athletes may remain on the shooting line throughout the match, indicating that they have finished shooting by raising a hand above their head.
- In case of a bye, teams may shoot on their own target if the schedule allows, under the same conditions as individual byes.
- Nomination forms for doubles and mixed teams are attached to this booklet and must be submitted as set out on the forms.

3.8 Equipment inspection

- Equipment inspection takes place during the official practice of the related category. Teams are called in alphabetical order by the Director of Shooting.
- Location: right side of the FOP
- All teams are to wear their team uniform and carry valid accreditation. Spare equipment must also be brought for inspection.
- **The classification card must be presented during the inspection.**
- Wheelchairs, stools, body straps, release aids, tactile sights and all other assistive devices are subject to inspection.
- Team managers must check beforehand that athlete details — name, date of birth, division and class — are correct, and inform the Judge of any error so the Results Team can be notified.

- Judges may require an athlete's equipment to be inspected at any time during the competition. See Book 5 and the World Archery Para Archery rules.

4. Key rules & reminders

4.1 Dress regulations

- Athletes, officials and staff shall wear appropriate clothing with the correct appearance on the field during competition. Open-toed shoes and camouflage clothing, accessories or equipment are not permitted.
- Athletes, team officials and technicians shall wear their national team uniform and sports shoes of the same appearance for the division. Athlete names and country names or codes are mandatory on the back of national team shirts.
- Each athlete or team shall register at least two different uniform tops at the official equipment inspection, for use at all elimination matches at the finals venue. The registered tops must be of clearly distinguishable colours or designs to give adequate visual contrast for spectators, media and broadcast.
- During finals with television coverage, undershirts, compression shirts or sleeves may be worn provided they match the predominant colour of the team shirt or are white.
- All teams are to wear their team uniform and carry valid accreditation during official practice.

4.2 Athlete, assistant and spotter (back) numbers

- Athlete numbers are issued on the day of the qualification round, together with the scorecards, during practice.
- Numbers must be worn on the quiver or thigh, facing the waiting line while shooting, throughout the event including the finals.
- **Assistants and spotters (for visually impaired athletes) must wear the same back number as the athlete they assist.**
- For detailed regulations refer to Book 5 (Outdoor Archery).

4.3 Assistants, spotters and assistive equipment

- Every assistant and spotter must be accredited. Only accredited persons are permitted in the athletes' area and on the field of play, and they must remain within the areas designated for them.
- Wheelchairs, stools, body straps, arm and finger supports, release aids, tactile sights and all other assistive devices must comply with the World Archery Para Archery rules and are subject to equipment inspection.
- Blindfolds or blackout glasses for visually impaired athletes must be worn as required by the rules and may be checked by the judges at any time.
- Any athlete requiring assistance to move between the waiting line and the shooting line should make this known to the Director of Shooting and the judges before the start of the session.
- Provision of chapter 42 of Book 5 will be applied with regard to Assistants, spotters and assistive equipment.

4.4 Timing, equipment failure and medical issues

- No extra time and no make-up arrows are allowed for equipment failure or for the treatment of medical problems during qualification and final rounds.
- Any athlete requiring medical attention on the field of play should raise the matter with a judge, who will call the event medical team.

4.5 Appeal procedure

- An appeal form is attached to this document. The times indicated on the form must be observed for both an intention to appeal and an actual appeal.
- Appeal forms are to be given to the Chairperson of the Tournament Judge Commission or the Deputy Chairperson.
- A fee of **USD 100** must be paid to the Chairperson for the appeal to be valid.
- If the appeal is upheld by the Jury of Appeal the fee is returned; if rejected, it is not.

5. Timing & results systems

World Archery timing equipment is used for timing and scoreboards in the preliminary rounds and the finals. During qualification and elimination rounds the clock runs until the end of the end, without interruption by the Director of Shooting.

Scoring tablets are used during the qualification and elimination rounds, but not in the finals.

► Qualification round

- Scoring is completed by the athletes. One athlete records, on the official paper scoresheet, the scores of all other athletes on that target, while another athlete on the same target enters all scores for that target into the scoring tablet.
- **Scorecards MUST be signed by both the athlete and the scorer**, with all totals mathematically correct and the 10s+Xs and X count fully completed.
- **Where the 10s+Xs and X count are not completed, a “0” is recorded for that athlete's 10s+Xs and X count. Any scorecard that is not signed, or where the score total is missing, will result in disqualification.**

► Elimination round

- One athlete or team records the arrow values of both athletes or teams on the paper scoresheet while the other enters the values into the scoring tablet. Both should verify that all scores are written and entered correctly before returning to the shooting line.
- At the end of the match the scorecard must be fully completed and signed by the athletes involved, or by the agent or judge in the case of finals.

► Lost arrows

- **All lost arrows must be reported to the judges immediately.** Once a lost arrow has been found, the judge must be advised.

6. Logistics

6.1 Arrivals, departures and transport

- Transport is provided free of charge between Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel International Airport (AMD) and the official hotel from **3 to 10 September 2026**. Teams are met by an LOC volunteer holding an event welcome board.
- Local transport between the official hotel, the practice field and the competition venues is provided free of charge. Daily timetables are posted in the hotel lobby and at the venue.
- Accessible vehicles are available. Teams should request them through the transport manager at least 24 hours in advance where possible.
- Any last-minute change to flight arrival details must be notified to the Organising Committee immediately.

6.2 Accommodation and meals

Official hotel	Crowne Plaza Hotel, Ahmedabad (five-star) — double / twin rooms, full board
Check-in	Athletes seeking classification: 3 September after 13:00 hrs. Classified athletes: 4 September after 13:00 hrs.
Check-out	10 September, before 11:00 hrs
Cost	Accommodation and three meals are provided free of charge by the LOC for the duration above. Nights outside this period are at the participant's own expense: US\$200 double / US\$170 single per day.
Meals	Breakfast and dinner are served at the hotel. Lunch is always served at the archery venue. Non-alcoholic drinks are included.

- **All participants — athletes, officials and guests — must stay in the official hotel.**
- Rooms are allocated on a first-come, first-served basis.
- Vegetarian, vegan, gluten-free and other dietary requirements are catered for; notify the LOC in advance.
- Packed meals can be requested for teams whose competition times fall outside service hours, at least 24 hours before the meal service.

6.3 Accessibility

Accessibility has been treated as a planning requirement throughout. Anything that does not work as intended should be reported immediately so it can be corrected during the week.

- Accessible rooms are allocated at the official hotel according to the requirements declared at entry.
- Level or ramped access is provided between the athletes' area, the waiting line, the shooting line and the target line, and accessible toilets are provided at the competition venue and the practice field.

- Accessible vehicles are available for all transfers. Shaded rest areas with seating and water are provided behind the shooting line.

6.5 Clean sport

World Archery's Anti-Doping Rules, aligned with the World Anti-Doping Code, protect athletes' health and ensure fair competition. Athletes and support personnel may be subject to doping control conducted by World Archery, the International Testing Agency (ITA) and/or the National Anti-Doping Agency of India (NADA).

- Doping control takes place at the final venue following the medal matches, under World Archery rules for world ranking events.
- Athletes selected for testing must produce an identity document or passport together with their event accreditation at the doping control station.
- Check every medication and supplement before use, and hold a valid Therapeutic Use Exemption where one is required. See Book 1 chapter 2.3 and Book 7.

6.6 Internet, water and media

- Internet access is free in the rooms and lobby of the official hotel, and Wi-Fi is available at the venue for access to results.
- Each participant receives clean bottled water; bottled water is available at all venues.
- All other hotel expenses — laundry, minibar, room service, telephone — are settled by the participants themselves.

7. Accreditation & protocol

7.1 Accreditation process

Accreditation office: Crowne Plaza Hotel, Ahmedabad – 3 & 4 September & Competition Venue – 5th onwards

Opening times: [3rd to 7th Sept, 2026] 09:00 am - 05:00 pm

Before arriving, confirm with your Member Association that all payments are complete, and carry proof of payment for anything not already recorded in your summary of costs on WAREOS.

Step	Action
1	Go to the LOC office. Complete any remaining payments and collect your invoices and the team nomination form, which must be stamped by the Organising Committee to prove that all payments are complete.
2	Check the team list and all information it contains. For an individual change, strike through the name to be removed and hand-write the new name. Date and sign the document, then go to the accreditation office.
3	Bring the signed document and any athletes listed under “missing picture” to the accreditation booth to collect accreditations and take the missing photographs.

Please note

Athletes listed in the “picture to retake” section should come later in the week, once the accreditation process is complete. Priority is given to missing pictures.

All participants must complete registration and accreditation on arrival. Access to the competition area is restricted to accredited individuals only, and the QR code on the accreditation is scanned to enter competition areas.

7.2 Accreditation cards

- Athletes and team officials registered in WAREOS receive one World Archery accreditation and lanyard valid for the 2026 season. It must be brought to all World Archery events and validated on site at each event. Assistants and spotters must be accredited and carry their accreditation at all times.
- Athletes without an existing photograph will have their picture taken at the venue the day before official practice. Please smile and wear your official Member Association team uniform — these photographs are used for accreditation and for athlete biographies on the website.
- Upgrade cards allow another accredited person or athlete to act as coach for a specific athlete or team. Each card is valid only for the assigned person and athlete or team, ceases to be valid once that athlete or team is eliminated, and is not available to teams already at the maximum number of officials or to guests.
- For further information on accreditation refer to Book 2, section 3.7.

7.3 Medal ceremonies

- Athletes involved in ceremonies should go to the gathering point at the athletes' entrance to the main field of play. Equipment can be stored in the staging area until the end of the corresponding victory ceremony.



- Bronze medal winners are requested to be present at the gathering point 20 minutes before the ceremony is due to start. Medal winners must be in full team uniform.
- On arrival at the venue, report to the Technical Delegate or the Competition Manager so they know your location.
- Ceremonies are conducted immediately after the interview of the gold medal winner in each category during the finals days. Athletes should proceed straight to the mixed zone or the ceremony area.
- Athletes requiring assistance to access the podium should inform the Competition Manager in advance.
