1. Sport Information

1.1. Archery Competition

1.1.1. Competition Date

The Archery competition of the 20th Asian Games will be held from 26 September to 3 October 2026 at Okazaki Chuo Sogo Park Multipurpose Square. Official Practice and equipment inspection will be on 25 September.

1.1.2. Competition Venue

The Archery competition of the 20th Asian Games will be held at Okazaki Chuo Sogo Park Multipurpose Square. The FOP (Field of play) for the Qualification Round will accommodate 40 targets, and the Final Field of Play will be staged next to the Qualification Field.

The competition venue is 30.8 kilometres away from the Athletes' Accommodation.

1.1.3. Number and Name of Events

The Archery competition of the 20th Asian Games consists of ten (10) events, including four (4) men's events, four (4) women's events, and two (2) mixed team events as follows:

-Men's events (4):

Recurve Individual, Recurve Team, Compound Individual, Compound Team

-Women's events (4):

Recurve Individual, Recurve Team, Compound Individual, Compound Team

-Mixed team events (2):

Recurve, Compound

1.4. Competition Rules

The Archery competition of the 20th Asian Games will be held as per the current World

Archery (WA) Constitution and Rules.

Detailed information is available on the WA website:

In case of any disagreement on the interpretation of the WA rules and regulations, the English version shall be binding. Any unforeseen cases not covered by the regulations and rules shall be resolved as follows:

- Technical issues: Resolved in accordance with the WA rules and regulations;
- General issues: Resolved in accordance with the Olympic Council of Asia (OCA) Constitution and Rules;

1.5. Competition Format

The Archery competition of the 20th Asian Games consists of the qualification round, the Olympic round for recurve, and the Compound round for compound.

A maximum of two (2) male archers and two (2) female archers per NOC may enter the Individual Elimination Round. Top 2 of each NOC will have positions in brackets depending on their ranking, **which change of archer is not allowed**.

The archery competition has following disciplines: Recurve and Compound.

Which includes the elimination and final rounds for Individual, Team and Mixed Team events. The draw must be made under the supervision of the Technical Delegate following the procedure described in the WA Constitution and Rules.

1.5.1. Recurve Individual

(1) Qualification Round

- Two (2) rounds of 36 arrows each
- Six (6) ends of six (6) arrows per round
- 180 seconds per end

(2) Elimination and Final Rounds

- 1/24 match-play chart.
- A maximum of five (5) sets of three (3) arrows—two (2) points for a win, one (1) point for a tie, and zero (0) points for a loss.
- Timing: 30 seconds per arrow for non-alternate shooting, 20 seconds per arrow for

alternate shooting.

- The first archer to reach six (6) points wins the match and qualifies for the next round.

All shots in the Qualification Round and Elimination Round are at a distance of 70 metres with a 122-centimetre target face, with a maximum of 10 points per arrow. For the Elimination Round, the archer who reaches 6 points first wins the match. After the Qualification Round, in case of deciding to enter the elimination round and in elimination series and final series (If the match is tied at 5-5 after the fifth set), there will be a single-arrow shoot-off, the archer whose arrow is closest to the centre will win. Each archer will shoot a second arrow if the arrow is measured at the same distance from the centre. Subsequent tie-break arrows are only required if the arrow cannot be separated by measuring.

1.5.2. Compound Individual

(1) Qualification Round

- Two (2) rounds of 36 arrows each
- Six (6) ends of six (6) arrows per round
- 180 seconds per end

(2) Elimination and Final Rounds

- 1/24 match-play chart.
- A cumulative scoring system will be used for five (5) ends of three (3) arrows per match.
- Timing: 30 seconds per arrow for non-alternate shooting, 20 seconds per arrow for alternate shooting.
- The archer with the highest cumulative points wins the match and advances to the next round.

All shots in the Qualification Round and Elimination Round are at a distance of 50 metres with an 80-centimetre, 6-ring target face (the lowest scoring zone is 5), with a maximum of 10 points per arrow. The archer with the highest cumulative points wins the match. After Qualification Round, in case of deciding to enter the elimination round and in elimination series and final series, if the cumulative points are tied, there will be a single-arrow shoot-off, and the archer whose arrow is closest to the centre will win.

1.5.3. Recurve Men & Women Team and Recurve Mixed Team

The top 24 teams from the Qualification Round for Men's Team, Women's Team, and Mixed Team will advance to the 1/12 elimination, with top 8 teams to have bye and compete in the elimination and final rounds for bronze and gold medals. After the qualification round, if there is a tie for 24th place and 8th place for teams, there will be a shoot-off match to decide which team proceeds to elimination round and 8th position to have a bye. Each archer per team shoots an arrow with a time limit of 30 seconds, and the team with the highest cumulative points wins; if the cumulative points are the same, the team with the arrow closest to the centre wins; if the distance is the same, the team with the second (or the third) arrow closest to the centre wins as to break the tie.

- For Recurve Men & Women Team, each team consists of 3 archers in the Qualification Round; for Recurve Mixed Team, each team consists of top 1 male and 1 female archers in the Qualification Round.

- The matches will be organised based on the results after the qualification round.

- A maximum of four (4) sets of six (6) arrows (four (4) arrows for Recurve Mixed Team), and two (2) arrows per archer with a time limit of 120 seconds (80 seconds for Recurve Mixed Team)—two (2) points for a win, one (1) point for a tied and zero (0) points for a loss. The first team to reach 5 points wins the match and qualifies for the next round.

- If the match is tied at 4-4 after the fourth set, there will be a shoot-off match. Each archer will shoot a single arrow, and the team who has the highest score will win the match. If the scores are tied, the team with the closest arrow to the centre will win the match, with the second and third arrows acting as further tiebreakers if required.

All shots are at a distance of 70 metres with a 122-centimetres target face, with a maximum of 10 points per arrow.

1.5.4. Compound Men & Women Team and Compound Mixed Team

The top 16 teams from the Qualification Round for Men's Team and Women's Team will advance to the 1/8 elimination. The top 24 teams from the Qualification Round for Mixed Team will advance to the 1/12 elimination and compete in the elimination and final rounds for bronze and gold medals. After the Qualification Round, if there is a tie for 16th place for men's and women's teams and 24th place and 8th place for mixed teams, there will be a shoot-off match to decide which team proceeds to elimination round, and 8th position to have a bye for mixed team. Each archer per team shoots a single arrow with

a time limit of 30 seconds, and the team with the highest cumulative points wins; if the cumulative points are the same, the team with the arrow closest to the centre wins; if the distance is the same, the team with the second (or the third) arrow closest to the centre wins so break the tie.

- For Compound Men & Women Team, each team consists of 3 archers in the Qualification Round; for Compound Mixed Team, each team consists of the top 1 male and 1 female archers in the Qualification Round.
- The matches will be organised based on the results after the qualification round.
- A maximum of four (4) sets of six (6) arrows (four (4) arrows for Compound Mixed Team), and two (2) arrows per archer with a time limit of 120 seconds (80 seconds for Compound Mixed Team)—The team with the highest cumulative points wins the match and qualifies for the next round.
- If the match is tied after the fourth set, there will be a shoot-off. Each archer will shoot a single arrow and the team who has the highest score will win the match. If the scores are tied, the team with the arrow closest to the centre will win the match, with the second and third arrows acting as further tiebreakers if required.

All shots are at a distance of 50 metres with an 80-centimetre, 6-ring target face (the lowest scoring zone is 5) with a maximum of 10 points per arrow.

1.6. Protests and Appeals

Protests and appeals shall be handled as per the latest WA constitution and rules. All technical appeals will be the responsibility of the WA and WAA. In the event of an intent to appeal or an actual appeal, NOCs must adhere to the times indicated on the Appeal form (available at SID, the Qualification Round Field DOS hut, Final field of play Call Room and Judges' scoring hut).

The intention to file an appeal must be lodged in writing with the Chairperson or Deputy Chairperson of the Tournament Judges Commission within five minutes of the end of the match or the qualification round. If no team official has been appointed, appeals must be presented by the team manager or by the appellant. To confirm whether there will be an appeal or not, agents are requested to remain on the field of play for five minutes after the end of the match or until the results are confirmed.

The Appeal form should be given to the Chairperson or Deputy Chairperson of the Judges. A fee of CHF 50 or USD 50 or EUR 50 or JPY 5000 must be paid to the Chairperson of the Tournament Judges Commission in order for the appeal to be valid. If the appeal is upheld by the Jury of Appeal, the fee will be returned. If the appeal is rejected, the fee will not be returned unless the Jury decides otherwise.

Any athlete/NOC may appeal to the International Council of Arbitration for Sport (ICAS) in the event that the athlete/NOC believes that there has been a violation of WA or WAA technical rules or the OCA Constitution, as long as the appeal is not related to reversing the decision of the Judge or the result.

1.7. Late Athlete Replacement Policy

The deadline for the final list of participating athletes in all sports at the Games is 01 July 2026.

The received list will be officially finalised once they are confirmed to be consistent with originals at the F-DRM meetings scheduled to be held in September 2026.

However, under exceptional circumstances (e.g., due to injury or other medical emergencies) and on a case-by-case basis, the OCA and relevant Asian and/or International Federation may allow the permanent replacement of an athlete by others after consulting with appropriate medical specialist.

The replacement of the athlete after SEQ deadline is possible providing:

- A) The replacement athlete is entitled and eligible to take part in the 20th Asian Games in accordance with the OCA Constitution and Rules.
- B) The appropriate National Olympic Committee (NOC) had applied for accreditation for the replacement athlete prior to the accreditation deadline on 14 May 2026:
- C) No doping control issues are pending concerning the replacement athlete.

In addition, making athlete replacements is possible by one day prior to the Team Managers' Meeting, but the following procedures must be followed to gain approval:

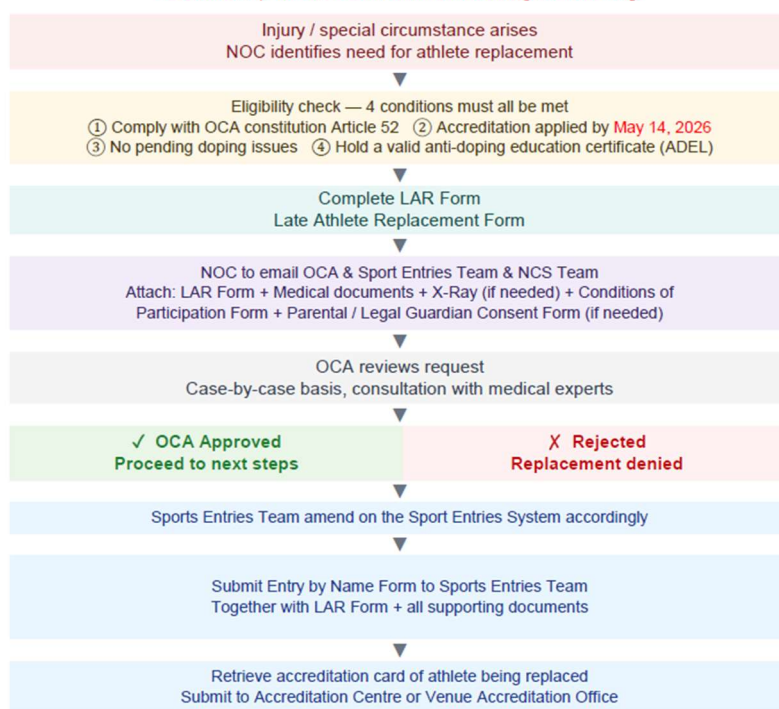
- A) The relevant NOC must duly complete an Official Late Athlete Replacement Form for the athlete being replaced and the replacement athlete.
- B) The accreditation card of the replaced athlete must be withdrawn and handed over either to Main Accreditation Centre or to Venue Accreditation Office.
- C) A Sport Entry Form must be duly completed by the relevant NOC for the replacement athlete.

The Sport Entries Department will forward all received copies of relevant documents to the Accreditation Centre and the OCA Sports Committee.

These policies may be adjusted or revised by the OCA for exceptional circumstances.

Note: Under special circumstances, the OCA reserves the right to amend the Late Replacement Policy.

1.8. Equipment and Clothing

Equipment used and clothing worn by athletes and other relevant participants in the competition must comply with the rules and regulations of the OCA and WA.

Neither athletes nor technical officials will be permitted to attach any form of commercial advertising to his or her competition uniform without prior approval of the OCA and the AINAGOC.

1.9. Olympic Council of Asia's Commercial Guidelines for the 20th Asian Games, Aichi Nagoya 2026

The NOCs acknowledge that the Commercial Affiliates may refer to themselves as Sponsors of the National Teams. Furthermore, the NOCs shall not appoint Sponsors of their National Teams in product categories which conflict with those granted to the Commercial Affiliates as notified to such NOCs.

These Commercial Guidelines prohibit the appearance of commercial publicity or manufacturer's identification that is not approved in accordance with Regulations below, on equipment or clothing used during the Asian Games. During the Asian Games, these Commercial Guidelines take precedence over International Sports Federation regulations relating to commercial branding and identification on clothing and equipment, unless otherwise approved by the Executive Board of the OCA.

To be eligible for participation in the Asian Games, an athlete must comply with these Commercial Guidelines.

2. Training

2.1. Training Rules

Training field will open from 23 September at Okazaki Chuo Sogo Park Multipurpose Square Archery Range.

Athletes' training must be conducted in accordance with the WA competition rules.

On Final Match days, 8 targets on the left side of field will be used as the warm-up area for athletes who have matches scheduled. The warm-up area will be open one hour before matches start.

The other side of the field will be used for training.

3. Competition Procedures

3.1. Pre-competition Procedures

3.1.1. Draw

On 24 September 2026, the draw for target assignment on qualification round will be conducted by the Result Team, under the supervision of the Technical Delegate in accordance with the WA rules.

3.1.2. Familiarization

Final Venue Familiarization will be provided from 23 to 24 September 2026. Please arrive at the call room 15 minutes in advance according to the Final Venue Familiarization Schedule. Any delay will be regarded as abandonment of the Final Venue Familiarization. The details of Final Venue Familiarization Schedule are as follows:

3.1.4. Equipment Inspection

Athlete equipment will be checked on 25 September 2026. During the inspection, all participating teams will be summoned to the inspection area in the alphabetical order of their NOCs. Athletes' equipment must be checked at the time specified in the official practice schedule.

RM&CW: 8:00-11:30;

RW&CM: 12:30-16:00;

During Official Practice, Athletes need to wear their official uniform and bring their equipment to be checked. Any equipment not fulfilling the requirement will be asked to

change or need to be masked.

3.1.5. Distribution of Athlete numbers

During the Qualification Round, athlete numbers will be distributed based on the results of the electronic draw for shooting positions with the scorecards.

During the Elimination Round, the athlete numbers will be distributed based on the ranking in the Qualification Round at the SID.

Athletes must wear their athlete number as follows:

- No athlete numbers may be cut, folded or covered in any way.
- Athlete numbers are to be prominently displayed on the athlete's quiver or thigh and always be visible from behind the waiting line while shooting.

3.2. Competition Procedures

3.2.1. Access to the Field of Play (FOP)

During a competition, only athletes participating in his/her event and one coach per athlete may enter the FOP.

On the Qualification round day, if there are three athletes, only three people can accompany them into the FOP. There will be identification ribbon for access check, which is transferable among the team.

3.2.2. Marking Arrow holes during Qualification Round

The target faces will NOT be changed after practice at qualification round. Athletes are kindly asked to mark their arrow holes during practice.

3.2.3. Mixed team shoot off and nomination

In case any shoot-off needed for mixed team, shoot-off for mixed team will be September 27th at Qualification Round Field. Nomination Form is attached at the end of this document and available at DoS and SID. Nomination Form must be submitted in case teams wish to change the athletes from highest scored athletes at Qualification Round in

timely manner to Result Verifier or CoJ.

3.2.4. Athletes' Agents

On the Elimination days, NOC is requested to assemble Agent at warm up area. If athletes are unable to allocate an Agent, NOC may request to CoJ at Team Managers' meeting, to have dedicated Agent for requested NOC at their respective match.

Agents are guided by marshal to Judge's scoring hut at Final FoP. After each match, Agents must exit by the same route they entered. Kindly asked to take their targets for their memorable match.

3.2.5. Warm-up

The warm-up area in training field will be open for the participating teams 60 minutes before the start of competition.

8 targets on the left side of training field will be warm-up area, for the athletes having matches that day.

After arriving at the venue, athletes should warm up in the warm-up area if you have a match that day.

3.2.6. Call in the Finals

Athletes must arrive at the Call Room 15 minutes before the start of the finals with the dress code fully complied.

Athletes' belongings will be collected at call room and will be returned at the end of match at the exit. For semifinal and medal matches, Athletes are advised to bring their official uniform for ceremony to call room.

3.2.7. Disqualification

- Athletes' whose arrow shot over the safety wall will immediately be disqualified.
 - if the arrow went over the safety wall, Athlete/Coach must report immediately to Judges.
- Any athlete found to be using equipment contravening World Archery Rules.

- An athlete who is proven to have knowingly broken any rules and regulations may be declared ineligible to participate in the competition.
- An athlete who, after being told to correct their drawing technique, persists in using a dangerous technique.
- Anyone who alters a score without authorisation, falsifies a score, or knowingly has a score altered or falsified.
- Unsportsmanlike conduct from any athlete or any person deemed to be assisting the athlete. Unsportsmanlike conduct will not be tolerated.
- An athlete found guilty of breaking any eligibility rule may be disqualified from the competition and, if so, will lose any position the athlete may have gained.
- An athlete found competing in a class laid down in Book 2, Article 4.2. Classes in which the athlete does not fulfil the requirements will be disqualified from the competition and lose any position gained.
- An athlete with a positive alcohol test will be disqualified, and the case will be forwarded to the Board of Justice and Ethics for further sanctions.

Athletes may receive one warning for the following. After being warned, those who continue breaking the rules or who do not follow the decisions and directives of the assigned judges will be disqualified.

- No athlete may touch the equipment of another without the latter's consent.
- No athlete may draw a bow, with or without an arrow, except when standing on the shooting line.
- Athletes or teams repeatedly found shooting more than the permitted number of arrows per end.
- An athlete may not raise the bow arm until the signal is given to start.
- If an athlete repeatedly withdraws arrows from the target before they are scored.
- Athletes repeatedly touching arrows or the target face before or during scoring the arrow values.
- While shooting is in progress, only those athletes whose turn it is to shoot may be on the shooting line, except for athletes with a classified disability.
- Smoking, vaping, or using electronic cigarettes is not allowed on the field of play or the practice field.

3.3. Post-Competition Procedures

3.3.1. Leaving the FOP

Athletes and team officials should leave the Final field of play immediately on the Line Judge's directions once the scores of the match have been confirmed by the Target Judge. From here, the athlete(s) will be guided to the mixed zone.

3.3.2. Doping Control

AINAGOC is committed to promoting clean sport, protecting athletes' health and upholding fair play principles. The anti-doping programme of the Aichi-Nagoya 2026 Games will:

- ✧ Come into force in accordance with the *World Anti-Doping Code* (hereinafter as "the Code"), the *OCA Anti-Doping Rules* (hereinafter as "the Rules") and *The 20th Asian Games Aichi-Nagoya 2026 Anti-Doping Guide* (hereinafter as "the Guide" in this section). The Rules outline, among other things, the various anti-doping rule violations; the results management process following a possible Anti-Doping Rule Violation (ADRV); require athletes to abide by the current *Prohibited List* of the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA);
- ✧ Share intelligence with OCA, ITA, WADA, IFs, AFs, National Anti-Doping Organisations (NADOs), Regional Anti-Doping Organisations (RADOs) and other law enforcement agencies;
- ✧ The OCA has testing jurisdiction in the period commencing three (3) months before the start of the pre-opening of the Athletes' Plaza at the Garden Pier on 2 September 2026 until up to and including the day of the Closing Ceremony on 4 October 2026.

In-competition refers to "the period commencing at 11:59 p.m. on the day before a competition in which the athlete is scheduled to participate through the end of such competition", and out-of-competition refers to "any period that is not in-competition", as stipulated in the *Code*, the *International Standard for Testing and Investigations* and the *Rules*;

- ✧ Require any athlete who is eligible to compete in the Games to undergo doping

control tests during the Aichi-Nagoya 2026 Games. An athlete may be subject to such tests more than once;

- ✧ Athletes' urine and/or blood samples will be collected during the Aichi-Nagoya 2026 Games in accordance with the Testing Distribution Plan provided by the ITA;
- ✧ Conduct doping control tests anywhere including but not limited to: Doping Control Stations in the accommodations, competition venues or training venues;
- ✧ Recruit volunteers as doping control chaperones to perform athletes notification.

3.3.3. Victory Ceremony

The Victory Ceremony will be held at the competition venue after each medal event. At the Victory Ceremony, medals and gifts will be presented to the top three (3) athletes or teams who registered for the final race or game (including ties). National (NOC) flags will be raised, and the respective anthem of the gold medalists will be played at the same time. The Victory Ceremony will be conducted in both English and Japanese. At the Victory Ceremony, the participating athletes or teams must wear their NOC official award-winning uniforms. Please arrive at the waiting area for the Victory ceremony 10 minutes before the ceremony. Detailed instructions regarding the ceremony procedures will be provided in the Waiting Area.

Athletes are not allowed to bring personal items such as flags, banners or mobile phones, and their AGIAC must be kept out of sight.

After the Victory Ceremony, the top three (3) athletes or teams (including ties) will be awarded medal boxes, and the top sixth (6) athletes or teams will receive victory diplomas. When AF has specific regulation, follow the AF definition. The medal boxes will be distributed to medalists on the way to mixed zone from victory ceremony. Diploma will be distributed by WEB system and printed by awarded athletes themselves. Detail procedure will be announced separately.

3.3.4. Mixed Zone

3.3.4.1. Broadcast Mixed Zone

All athletes are required to pass through the Broadcast Mixed Zone after the competition. However, athletes are not obligated to comply with interview requests in this area.

The Broadcast Mixed Zone is directly connected to the Press Mixed Zone, ensuring a seamless transition for athletes and media representatives.

***Medal Ceremony Procedure:**

If an athlete is scheduled to attend the medal ceremony, the Ceremony Producer or Sports Manager will notify the HB and Press Mixed Zone Manager. These athletes will then be escorted to the ceremony briefing area. After the medal ceremony, they will return to the Broadcast Mixed Zone and pass through the area.

3.3.4.2. Press Mixed Zone

Athletes must pass through Press Mixed Zone right after passing through Broadcast Mixed Zone so that they can be interviewed by accredited press as soon as possible after the competition ends. Athletes must undergo Doping test (included but not limited to) after passing through Press Mixed Zone. In case it's occurred after a Press conference, it must be conducted at after the Press conference.

3.3.5. Press Conference

After the final of each event, in principle, a post-competition press conference will be arranged. At Press conferences, interpreting simultaneously in 6 languages (Japanese, English, Chinese, Korean, Russian and Arabic) will be provided. Translating a participant's native language into English, if needed, should be done by the Press Attaché(s) or staff of the relevant NOC taking part.

After entering the press operations zone, press conference participants will be guided by the staff of press operation team or volunteers. IFs/AFs and competition operation team of the venue will provide necessary support and assistance, to ensure that participants will attend the press conference on time. In case it's occurred after a Press conference, it must be conducted at after the Press conference.

3.3.6. Results

Upon the conclusion of each competition, the results will be delivered to the Sport Information Desk (SID) and released on the Games Hub.

3.3.7.Results Book and USB Flash Drive

After the Aichi-Nagoya 2026 Asian Games, AINAGOC will send all NOCs the Results Books of all sports/disciplines contested at the Games and provide a USB flash drive.

4. Transport

4.1. Overview

Transportation services (TA) will primarily be provided from the athletes' and NOCs' accommodation facilities.

Details regarding provided services during the pre-opening period will be updated later.

4.2. Transport Services for arrival and departure

Bus transportation services will be provided between the official entry and exit points and each accommodation facility.

4.3. Transport Services within the Athletes' Plaza

Shuttle bus transportation will be provided between the cruise ship and Villas. The shuttle buses will operate at intervals of 30 to 60 minutes.

4.4. Transport Services for Competition

Transportation Between Accommodations and Competition Venues

Transportation will be provided from the accommodation to the competition venue.

- Transportation will primarily be provided by bus, operating on the following schedule:
- Before competition: Every 30 minutes, from 90 minutes before the start of the competition until the start time
- During competition: Every 60 minutes
- After competition: Every 30 minutes, from the end of the competition until 2 hours after

4.5. Transport Services for Training

Transportation Between Accommodations and Training Venues

Transportation will be provided from the accommodation to the training venue.

- Transportation will primarily be provided by bus, operating on the following schedule:

- Every 60 minutes, from 1 hour before the start of training until 1 hour after the end of training.

- Transportation on the Day of the Opening and Closing Ceremonies

On the day of the ceremonies, in principle, transportation services to competition and training venues will not be provided, except for venues where competitions are scheduled to take place on the same day.

4.6. Transport Services for Opening and Closing Ceremonies

Transportation services will be provided from each accommodation facility to Mizuho Park Athletics Stadium in Nagoya City."

5. General Information

5.1. Arrivals and Departures

Official entry/exit points for Games are Chubu Centrair International Airport and Nagoya Station.

5.1.1. Arrival services

Services such as guidance and assistance, and baggage handling support upon arrival will be provided at Chubu Centrair International Airport. Additionally, services will be offered for validating the Pre-valid Card (PVC), transportation to accommodations, and dedicated lanes/counters for quarantine, immigration and customs. Procedures such as PVC validation will be handled at 'Welcome Centre 1', which will be set up at the Aichi Sky Expo, located near the airport.

For those not using Chubu Centrair International Airport, each National Olympic Committee (NOC) will need to travel to Nagoya Station, wherein services such as guidance and assistance, baggage handling support upon arrival, and transportation to accommodations will be available. For those arriving at Nagoya Station, procedures such as PVC validation will be provided at 'Welcome Centre 2', which will be located at the Garden Pier.

As an exception, for delegations participating in competitions held in Tokyo (Aquatics [Swimming/Diving] and Equestrian), services such as guidance and assistance, baggage handling support upon arrival, and transportation to accommodations will also be provided at Narita International Airport.

5.1.2. Departure services

At Chubu Centrair International Airport, transportation services from each accommodation, such as guidance and assistance from arrival at the airport to the check-in counters, baggage handling support will be provided.

For those not using Chubu Centrair International Airport, each National Olympic

Committee (NOC) will receive transportation services to Nagoya Station, after arrival at the station, services such as guidance and assistance, baggage handling support will be available.

As an exception, for delegations participating in competitions held in Tokyo (Aquatics [Swimming/Diving] and Equestrian), transportation services from accommodations will also be provided to Narita International Airport and Tokyo International Airport (Haneda). At Narita International Airport, services such as guidance and assistance from arrival at the airport to the check-in counters as well as baggage handling support will be provided.

5.1.3. Arrivals and Departures System (ADS)

A web-based Arrivals and Departures System (ADS) will be implemented to consolidate all entry and exit data related to the Asian Games.

The ADS will start operating in May 2026, and NOCs are encouraged to submit all arrival and departure data in July 2026. Furthermore, if any changes occur after the initial submission, each NOC must update their data accordingly.

Each NOC is required to submit information into the ADS, including arrival and departure details, quantity and dimensions of baggage and sports equipment and any other special requirements or remarks. For AINAGOC to adequately prepare services such as PVC validation, transportation to accommodations, protocol services (if applicable) and other related services, each NOC should provide detailed and accurate information.

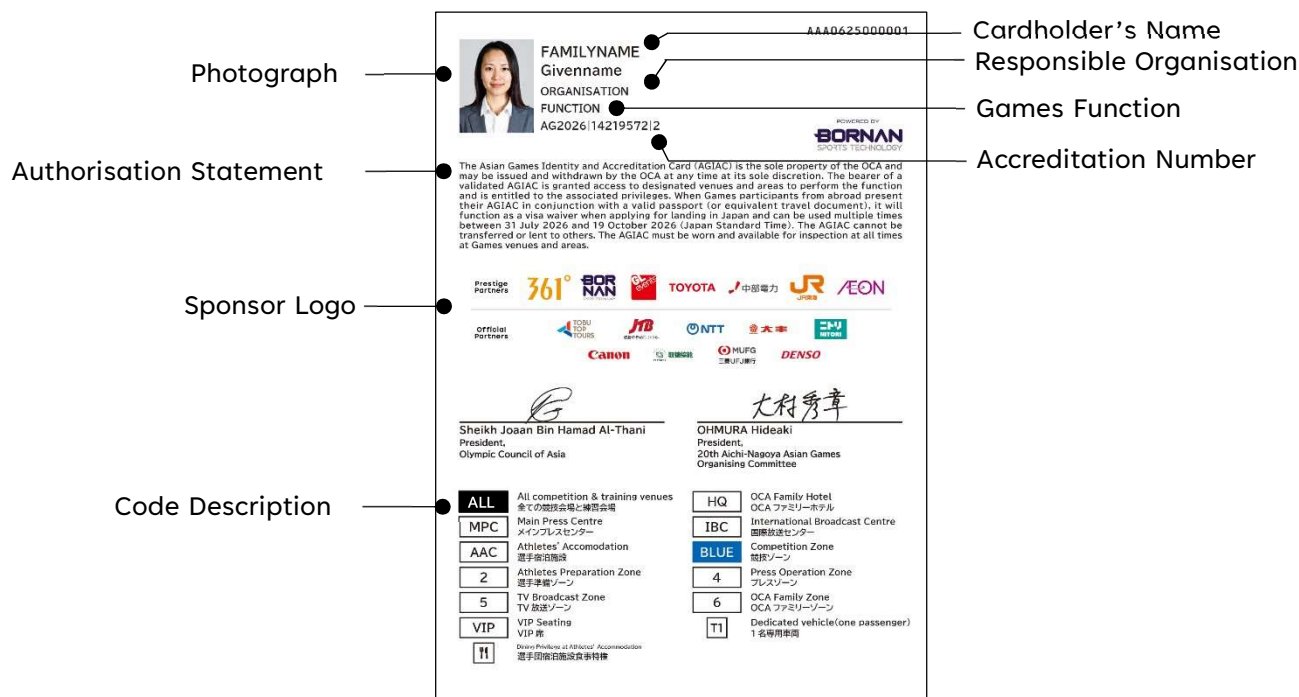
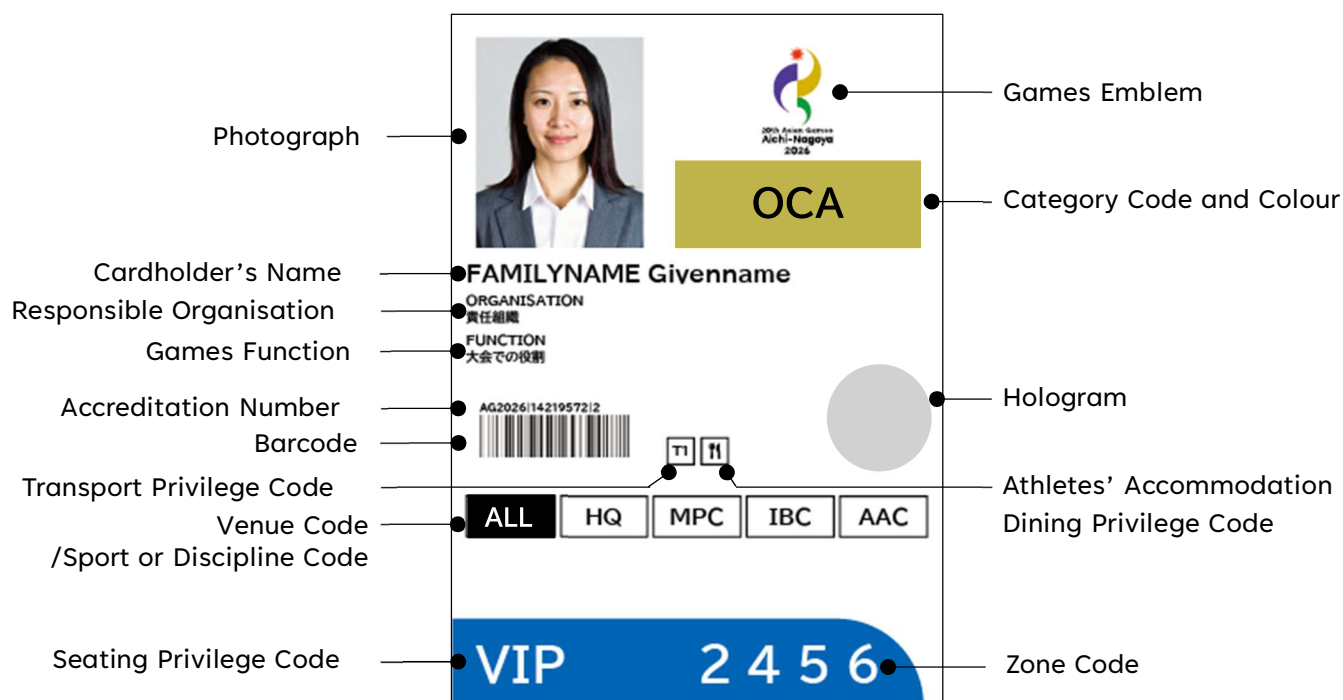
If inaccurate or incomplete information is submitted, the NOC may not properly receive these services. In addition, NOCs must report the latest information to the NOC Service Centre or information desks located at each accommodation if there are any updates on the arrival or departure information during the Games.

5.2. Accreditation

The Asian Games Identity and Accreditation Card (AGIAC) serves as an official identity document for the 20th Asian Games Aichi-Nagoya 2026. It is issued by AINAGOC with the authorisation of the OCA and certifies the cardholder's eligibility to participate in the Games. Prior to validation, the AGIAC is referred to as the Pre-Valid Card (PVC). After validation at the accreditation facility, the PVC becomes the AGIAC which grants access to venues and zones. The identity document presented when validated must be the same document used in the application for accreditation.

When participants present the PVC or the AGIAC in conjunction with their valid passport (or equivalent travel document), it will function as a visa waiver when applying for landing in Japan and can be used multiple times between 0:00 on 31 July 2026 and 23:59 on 19 October 2026 (Japan Standard Time).

Non-Japanese nationals using a passport as their identity document must ensure that it is valid for the entire duration of their stay in Japan. AINAGOC recommends that passports have an expiry date beyond 31 December 2026.

5.2.3. Dealing with special cases

Procedures for reissuing the PVC or the AGIAC in case of loss or damage and the method for collecting the PVC after entering Japan are as follows.

5.2.3.1. Loss or Damage of PVC before Entering Japan

If a PVC is lost or damaged before entering Japan, the participant must report it immediately to their NOC, and the NOC must report it to Accreditation Team.

The lost or damaged PVC will be cancelled, and a new PVC will not be delivered to the participant prior to departure for Japan. The participant must obtain their own visa (or equivalent travel document) at their own cost to enter Japan. After the participant has entered Japan, they must fill out an Accreditation Card Replacement Request Form at an accreditation facility that can reissue the AGIAC. After confirming their identity document, the accreditation facility will reissue the AGIAC.

5.2.3.2. Loss or Damage of validated AGIAC

If a validated AGIAC is lost or damaged, the participant must complete the Accreditation Card Replacement Request Form at the nearest accreditation facility that can reissue the AGIAC.

The lost or damaged AGIACs will be deactivated, and a new AGIAC will be reissued once the participant's identity document has been confirmed.

The damaged AGIAC must be returned to an accreditation facility. Additionally, if a lost AGIAC is subsequently found, it must also be returned immediately.

5.2.3.3. Collection of AGIAC after Entering Japan

For applicants who submit their accreditation applications after the deadline, AINAGOC cannot guarantee that they will receive their PVC before their departure for Japan. The participant must obtain their own visa (or equivalent travel document) at their own cost to enter Japan.

After entering Japan, the applicant must visit an accreditation facility and present their identity document to have their AGIAC issued.

5.2.4. Accreditation Facilities and Services

During the Games, AINAGOC will operate one Main Accreditation Centre (MAC), six Sub Accreditation Centres, two Accreditation Validation Desks. Each competition venue (excluding some) will have Venue Accreditation Offices (VAO), and Games Information Desks will be set up at each Athletes' Accommodation where they will be staying. Table 5.2.5 lists all accreditation facilities and the services provided.

- Main Accreditation Centre (MAC) provides services such as the PVC validation, the AGIAC reissuance, and inquiry services.
- Sub Accreditation Centres provide services such as the PVC validation, the AGIAC reissuance, Guest Pass production and inquiry services.
- Accreditation Validation Desks provide services such as the PVC validation.
- Venue Accreditation Offices (VAO) provide services such as the PVC validation, the AGIAC reissuance, and Day Pass production.
- Games Information Desks provide services such as the PVC validation and Guest Pass production.

Notes:

- For arrivals at Chubu Centrair International Airport, the PVC should be validated at the Accreditation Validation Desks located at Chubu Centrair International Airport and Welcome Centre 1 in Aichi Sky Expo.
- For arrivals at Nagoya station for NOCs, the PVC should be validated at the Sub Accreditation Centre at Welcome Centre 2 in Garden Pier.
- For arrivals at Narita International Airport for NOCs (Aquatics and Equestrian), the PVC should be validated at the Sub Accreditation Centre at the Athletes' Accommodation in Tokyo.

5.3. Games-Spectating Policy for Athletes and Team Officials

Different Discipline Athletes (DDA)

Different Discipline Athletes (DDA) ticketing programme allows athletes and team officials to watch competitions in disciplines other than their own free of charge.

Follow-My-Team (FMT)

Follow My Team (FMT) ticketing programme allows NOCs to secure a limited number of tickets for final matches of a particular team. Priority will be given to NOCs whose teams advance to the final rounds.

Athletes' Family and Friends (AFF)

Athletes' Family and Friends (AFF) ticketing programme allows family members and friends of athletes to purchase a limited number of tickets for the sessions in which the athletes compete.

5.4. Ceremonies

5.4.1. Opening Ceremony

The Opening Ceremony will be held at Nagoya City Mizuho Park Athletic Stadium on 19 September 2026 at 18:00. Each NOC delegation can send a certain number of athletes and team officials to take part in the Athletes Parade at the Opening Ceremony. Athletes staying in the Nagoya Area will be able to participate in the Opening Ceremony on-site. Athletes staying in Remote Areas will be able to enjoy the Opening Ceremony at their accommodation.

The quota for Athletes Parade participants and the policy on Marching Passes will be released separately.

● **Marching Order**

NOC delegations taking part in the Athletes Parade will be arranged in alphabetical order as per Annexure III of the OCA Constitution and Rules, except that the host country shall be the last.

● **Staging for Athletes Parade**

After arriving at the venue from accommodation, athletes and team officials will be aligned according to the marching order and wait for the start of parade at the indoor

waiting area.

● Uniforms

The official uniforms and accessories worn by participants in the Athletes Parade should comply with the security requirements of the Opening Ceremony and the OCA. Please note that it is not allowed to carry bags during the parade.

● Opening Ceremony Tickets

AINAGOC, based on the actual situation of the Opening Ceremony programme, will provide seats and tickets for the athletes and team officials not attending the Opening Ceremony.

● Catering

Athletes and team officials participating in the Opening Ceremony will be provided with bottles of water and complementary light snacks at the waiting area.

5.4.2. Closing Ceremony

The Closing Ceremony will be held at Nagoya City Mizuho Park Athletic Stadium on 4 October 2026 at 18:00.

The quota for Athletes Parade participants, the policy on Marching Passes, order of Athletes Parade and so on, will be announced later.

Requirements on uniforms, items, as well as services for tickets, catering, and other services for the Closing Ceremony will be of a similar standard to those for the Opening Ceremony.

5.4.3. Team Welcome Ceremony

AINAGOC will hold Team Welcome Ceremonies for NOC delegations from September 16 to 18 at the Athletes' Plaza. Each ceremony will include five (5) NOCs at one time, three (3) times per day. Participants will be Representative of the Team, Athletes and team officials staying at Athletes Plaza (Garden Pier or Kinjo Pier). Ceremonies will be distributed on Web for remote accommodation. Time schedule, and content will be announced later.

5.5. Medical Services

AINAGOC will work closely with local public health centres and the relevant health

authorities of each city to implement food safety measures, environmental hygiene management, and infectious disease prevention throughout the Games. These efforts aim to maintain sanitary conditions at all Games-related facilities and protect the health of all participants.

Smoking (Including heated tobacco products, waterpipes (hookahs), electronic cigarettes, and similar devices) is strictly prohibited in all areas inside of the competition venues. And, also in principle, smoking is prohibited in the other Games-related areas.

Furthermore, smoking by individuals under the age of 20 is strictly prohibited under Japanese law.

5.6. Sport Services

Sport Information Desk (SID)

All Archery-specific information will be available from the Sport Information Desk (SID) at the competition venue. The SID will provide the following information and services:

- Competition schedules, competition results, draws, entry lists, start lists, daily training schedules, and other key information
- Distribution of training schedules to each participating team, reservation of training time and venues
- Detailed weather data and updates
- General assistance and enquiries

The operating hours of the SID will vary according to the competition schedule of the respective sport/discipline at each venue.

Sport Information Centre (SIC)

The Sport Information Centre (SIC) in the NOC Service Centre will provide general sport-related information and services, including:

- Competition schedules, competition results, draws, entry lists, start lists, daily training schedules, and other key information
- Detailed weather data and updates
- General assistance and enquiries

The SIC will operate on a pre-opening basis from 2 September 2026, daily from 08:00 to 20:00. It will officially open on 6 September 2026 and operate daily from 07:00 to 22:00

until 4 October 2026, closing upon the conclusion of all competitions.

In addition to the SID and the SIC, the Games Information Desk at each athletes' accommodation will offer limited support.

Games Hub

Games Hub is the official Games information system providing details such as competition schedules, results, reports, medal standings and new records. The following categories are covered:

Game Hub is available in English only.

Games Hub terminals are dedicated computers that provide access only to the Games Hub system. These will be installed in designated venues, with Games Hub printers available if necessary.

In addition to Games Hub terminals, accredited NOC members and media personnel will be able to access Games Hub via personal devices through my Games Hub accounts.

We will provide separate instructions on how to access Games Hub from personal devices.

5.8. Language Services

AINAGOC will provide professional interpretation, volunteer language assistance and over-the-phone interpretation for our stakeholders.

5.8.1. Professional Interpretation

Professional interpretation will be provided simultaneously in six (6) languages (Japanese, English, Chinese, Korean, Russian and Arabic) for press conferences at Main Press Centre (MPC) and competition venues.

Translating a participant's native language into English, if needed, should be done by the Press Attaché(s) or staff of the relevant NOC taking part.

5.8.2. Volunteer language assistance

Language support volunteers will, in principle, provide consecutive interpretation between English and Japanese in the mixed zone at competition venues.

5.8.3. Over-the-phone interpretation

In case of emergency, AINAGOC will provide over-the-phone interpretation in six (6) languages (Japanese, English, Chinese, Korean, Russian and Arabic) for our stakeholders in need.

Dedicated phone numbers will be distributed to the medical room and the doping control

station.

5.8.4. Other language support

AINAGOC will distribute interpretation apps to AINAGOC staff and volunteers that support more than 30 languages, including the six (6) languages listed above, to help them communicate with our stakeholders.

5.9. Weather Services

The 20th Asian Games Weather Information Centre provides weather information primarily through the weather system provided by “WeatherNews.”

5.10. Security

The 20th Asian Games Aichi-Nagoya 2026 will implement appropriate and safety measures at all Games venues to ensure a secure environment for all participants.

All NOC delegation members must comply with Japanese laws and the Visitor (Athlete) Compliance Regulations outlined below during their stay.

5.10.1. Venue access control

In principle, vehicle screening area, a pedestrian screening area and an accreditation checkpoint will be established at each venue entrance.

To enter the venue, all Games participants and vehicles must present valid accreditation cards or VAPP and undergo a security checks.

Vehicles travelling from another clean venue, in line with the 'Clean to Clean' principle, will not require occupant screening; the VAPP and accreditation card must be presented to confirm its validity.

Each venue will also be patrolled by security personnel 24 hours a day.

5.10.2. Venue Visitor (Athlete) Compliance

Visitors (Athletes) must follow the designated Visitor (Athlete) Compliance Regulations, which specify prohibited behaviours and items that must not be brought into the venue.

These rules apply to entry into the Games venues. For information regarding restrictions and prohibitions when entering Japan, refer to [Goods with Prohibitions, Controls and Restrictions : Japan Customs](#).

In addition, any items resembling a prohibited object in appearance, such as replica firearms, simulated explosive devices or white powders that may resemble illicit substances, will be prohibited, regardless of legality or safety.

Items that are normally prohibited but required for specific Games-related purposes by athletes, team officials or competition partners may be exempted if the NOC applies for and receives approval for exemption in advance.

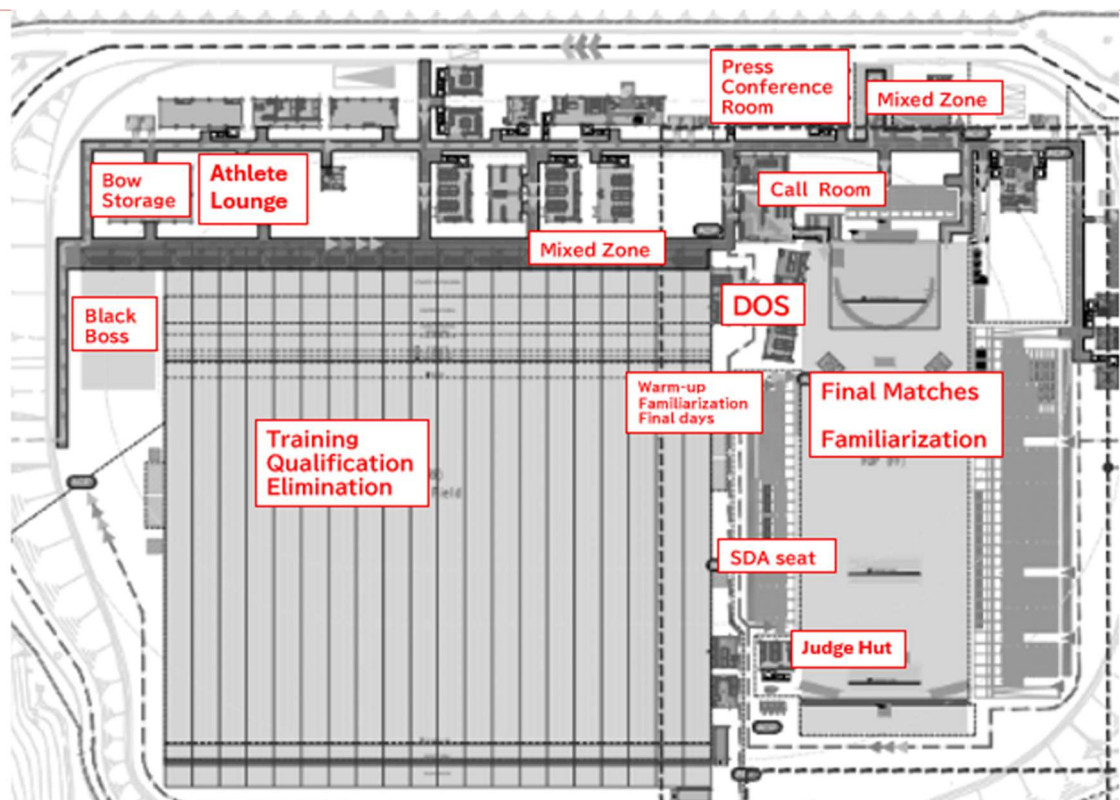

3.12.3.1. An intention to appeal when it might affect the progression of an athlete from one stage of the competition to the next must be submitted in writing and lodged with the chairperson or deputy chairperson of the Tournament Judge Commission within five minutes of the end of the relevant round or match. During the Finals of match play rounds, the Notice of Intent to File an Appeal must be submitted in writing to the chairperson, deputy chairperson of the Judge Commission, within five minutes of the end of the match.

3.12.9. Jury decisions will be minuted and reported to the appellant, the chairperson of the Tournament Judge Commission and the organisers before the beginning of the next stage of the competition or before the awarding of medals.

3.12.4. An appeal is subject to a fee that will be returned if the appeal is upheld or if the Jury of Appeal decides that it is appropriate. The amount will be determined by the Executive Board on an annual basis.
